# 11. Proposal to support the IDIA Project (Increasing Diversity by Increasing Access to Legal Education Project) by way of granting fee waivers to all IDIA scholars who get admission to HNLU. Notes:

The University is in receipt of email communication dated July 6, 2015 (Copy enclosed, Pg.Nos.88 to 89) from Prof. (Dr.) M.P. Singh, Professor and Head of Comparative Constitutional Law, NLU Delhi and Former Vice Chancellor, WB NUJS to Hidayatullah National Law University, Naya Raipur to support the IDIA Project (Increasing Diversity by Increasing Access to Legal Education) Project by way of granting fee waivers to all IDIA scholars who gain admission to HNLU.

In his communication he has stated that "IDIA was started at NUJS during his stay there. Shamnad later made it a mission and is carrying it forward with his as well as Justice Ruma Pal's support. It is also being supported by all NLUs by allowing IDIA students to study without payment of fee.

#### Introduction to IDIA:

The IDIA (Increasing Diversity by Increasing Access to Legal Education) project is a pan India movement to train underprivileged students and help transform them to leading lawyers and community advocates. IDIA is premised on the notion that access to premier legal education empowers marginalized communities and helps them help themselves.

The project is run on the backbone of highly passionate student volunteers from various law schools, who travel across the length and breadth of India to identify marginalised students with aptitude for the study of law. It then trains these selected students through a rigorous program for the leading law entrance examination, CLAT (Common Law Admission Test) and AILET (All India Law Entrance Test).

Once selected to the top law schools, IDIA arranges for sponsorships/scholarships and mentorship schemes to help candidates blossom to their full potential and take their rightful places as leading lawyers and community advocates.

In the last four years, approximately 40 students trained by IDIA procured admission to the leading National Law Universities (NLUs) in India. They reflect a truly diverse mix, comprising candidates from various backgrounds (children of farmers, stone quarry workers, shopkeepers and clerks) and hailing from various states such as Karnataka, West Bengal, Jharkand, Rajasthan, Bihar, Manipur and Mizoram.

	<u>Request for Fee Waiver</u> : The National Law University of India (NLSIU), the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences (WBNUJS) and the National Law University Delhi (NLUD) have in the past committed to granting fee waivers to all IDIA scholars who gain admission into their universities. This year, two of IDIA scholars secured admission into NLSIU and one into WBNUJS, and all three were granted full fee waivers. Therefore, we appeal to you to extend a similar waiver to IDIA scholars, failing which the dreams of such students intending to study at one of the best institutes of legal education in the country will remain unfulfilled. IDIA has further requested HNLU's commitment to grant fee waivers to IDIA scholars who seek admission to HNLU in future."
	Accordingly, the matter is placed for discussion and decision for University's approval for fee waiver to IDIA scholars admitted to HNLU, treating their admission as under supernumerary quota so that University may not have to bear any financial loss on this account.
12.	Proposal for periodical enhancement of Fee of students.
	The University has limited source of income i.e. Fee from students and State Government grant to meet its recurring expenditure. Although the State Government has enhanced its recurring Grant from three crores to four crores per annum w.e.f. F.Y. 2015-16 but it is not sufficient. The cost of living is increasing day by day due to inflation, increase in dearness allowances to be paid to teaching and non- teaching employees, increase in cost of commodities, electricity charges, fuel cost, taxes, infrastructure, maintenance cost of equipments, buildings etc. It is observed that there is about 10% (Ten percent) overall increase in the cost per year.
	In view of this, it is proposed that fee of students may be enhanced @ 10% (Ten percent) of the total fees once in three years which will be applicable only to the new students taking admission in that year. This increase in fee will not be applicable to students already admitted. Further, it is proposed that the Vice-Chancellor may be authorized to effect this overall enhancement of 10% (Ten percent) in the fee structure.
	It has also been observed that there is a regular sharp increase in the cost of meals owing to inflation in the prices of grains, vegetables, edible oils, food items, cost of labour, commercial cooking gas and other items. It is proposed that in order to maintain the quality of food of the students, the mess charges may be enhanced by 5% (Five percent) every year for all the students of the University.

Recommendations of the Finance Committee meeting dated 08.08.2014 are placed before the Executive Council for its decision.

Decision 2(a)

The Executive Council approved the revised budget estimates for the F.Y. 2014-15 and Budget Estimates for the F.Y. 2015-16 as recommended by the Finance Committee in its meeting dated 08.08.2014.

(b) On the recommendations of the Finance Committee meeting dated 26.11.2013, the Executive Council of the University in its meeting dated 14.12.2013 had accorded approval to the estimates of Rs.7.17 Crores (Rupees Seven Crores Seventeen Lacs) for Extension of New Academic Block by constructing two more floors comprising about twelve standard size classrooms and chambers for teachers.

However, on reassessment, it had been found that construction of only one more floor comprising six classrooms and six chambers for teachers would be sufficient to meet the University's existing requirements.

In lieu of earlier proposed second floor of the new Academic Block, it is proposed to carry out the following works:-

- Construction of One Utility Centre capable of catering to the daily needs of the residents of HNLU campus. The Utility Centre would comprise Saloon, Provision Store, Dispensary and Medical Store, Fruit and Juice centre, Dry Cleaning etc.
- Construction of Boundary walls for new Hostels and Guest House
- Construction of Cement Concrete Approach Road for new Hostels and other buildings not yet connected by roads;
- Construction of One Car shed and Workshop-cum-Store;
- Contribution of University's share as per UGC guidelines towards UGC funded buildings namely Guest House, Academic Building, Canteen, Staff Quarters, Basic Facilities for Women, constructed under UGC Schemes towards XI Plan period.

The estimated cost of all these proposed works comes out to Rs.7,17,00,000/- (Rupees Seven Crores Seventeen Lacs) only which has already been approved by the Executive Council in its meeting dated 14.12.2013 for the extension of the new academic block. There shall be no additional financial burden on the University for carrying out the newly proposed works.

Section 15(2) of the Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh Act, 2003 (No. 10 of 2003) provides as under:-Quote

"15(2) The Statutes as contained in the Schedule to this Act as amended from time to time, shall be binding on all authorities, officers, teachers and employees of the University and persons connected with the University." Unquote

- (b) The Executive Council of the University in the abovesaid meeting had also decided to enhance the age of superannuation
  - (i) of teachers from 60 (sixty) years to 65 (sixty five) years; and
  - (ii) of non-teaching employees from 60 (sixty) years to 62 (sixty two) years.

It is proposed that amendments as required under Clause (a) and (b) of agenda item No.3 may be made in the appointment orders of the Vice-Chancellor, teachers and non-teaching employees of the University.

It is also proposed that recommendation may also be made to Hon'ble the Chief Justice, High Court of Chhattisgarh and the Chancellor of the University for amending the existing appointment order of the Vice-Chancellor in view of the State Government Gazette notification to this effect.

## Decision:

The Executive Council decided that amendments as required under Clause (a) and (b) of agenda item No.3 may be made in the appointment orders of the Vice-Chancellor, teachers and nonteaching employees of the University.

The Executive Council also decided that recommendation may be made to Hon'ble the Chief Justice, High Court of Chhattisgarh and the Chancellor of the University to amend the existing appointment order of the Vice-Chancellor for the purpose of enhancing the age of superannuation from "sixty-five years" to "seventy years" in view of the publication of the amendment on 12.04.2014 in the Official Gazette of the State Government Gazette to this effect and as per the provisions contained in Section 15(2) of the Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh Act, 2003 (No. 10 of 2003).

4. <u>Proposed amendment in the University Statutes regarding</u> <u>extension of tenure as per provisions contained in the HNLU Staff</u> <u>Regulations and similar provisions in Statutes of some other</u> <u>National Law Universities of India.</u> Notes:

The Executive Council of the University in its meeting dated 18.12.2005 had approved the HNLU Staff Regulations. Section 8.3(1)(b)

of these Regulations, specifically provides for extension of tenure of the Viće-Chancellor, which reads as under:-

Quote

"(b) On the basis of satisfactory services, after the expiry of normal tenure of 5 years, the Executive Council may request the Chancellor to consider extension of the tenure. Such extension of tenure of the Vice-Chancellor can be extended upto the age limit of 65 years" Unquote

This age limit of 65 years has now been substituted by 70 years, by latest amendment to the Statute. Similar provisions regarding extension of tenure/second term to Vice-Chancellors are also contained in Statutes of some other National Law Universities of India such as the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata; the National Law School of India University, Bangalore; the NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad; and the Gujarat National Law University, Gandhinagar.

In order to implement the provisions contained in the HNLU Staff Regulations regarding extension of tenure of the Vice-Chancellor of the University, the following amendment in the Statute 19(5) is proposed:-*Quote* 

In exercise of the powers conferred under section 15(3) of the Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh Act 2003 (No. 10 of 2003), the Executive Council of the University recommends the following amendment in Statute 19(5) contained in the Schedule to this Act:-

AMENDMENT TO THE STATUTE 19(5) CONTAINED IN THE

SCHEDULE TO THE HIDAYATULLAH NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF LAW CHHATTISGARH ACT 2003 (NO. 10 OF 2003) BY ADDING PROVISO

19(5)(A) AS UNDER:-

"19(5)(A) On the basis of satisfactory services, after the expiry of normal tenure of 5 (five) years, the Executive Council may recommend to the Chancellor to extend the tenure of the Vice-Chancellor for a period of next 5 (five) years. Provided such extension of tenure of the Vice-Chancellor can be upto the age of 70 (seventy) years only. Provided further, that upon the expiry of his term, the Vice-Chancellor shall continue in office until his successor is appointed and enters upon his office.

In order to ensure certainty about the next Vice-Chancellor, such recommendation be made reasonably well before the expiry of the normal tenure of the Vice-Chancellor."

Accordingly, the matter is placed before the Executive Council for perusal and decision.

# AMENDMENT TO THE STATUTE 19(5) CONTAINED IN THE SCHEDULE TO THE HIDAYATULLAH NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF LAW CHHATTISGARH ACT 2003 (NO. 10 OF 2003) BY ADDING PROVISO 19(5)(A) AS UNDER:-

"19(5)(A) On the basis of satisfactory services, well before the expiry of normal tenure, the Executive Council of the University may recommend to the Chancellor of the University to extend the existing tenure of the Vice-Chancellor, beyond his/her initial tenure, for a period of next five years and the Chancellor shall have the power to grant such extension of the existing tenure of the Vice-Chancellor, provided that such extension of tenure of the Vice-Chancellor can be upto the age of seventy years only. Provided further, that upon the expiry of his/her term, the Vice-Chancellor shall continue to remain in office until his/her successor is appointed and enters upon his/her office. In order to ensure certainty about the next Vice-Chancellor, such

recommendation be made by the Executive Council reasonably well before the expiry of the normal tenure of the Vice-Chancellor." Unquote

The Executive Council noted that as per Section 15(4) of the Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh Act, 2003, the above amendment shall not take effect unless the Chancellor, after consultation with the State Government, has assented to it. Hence, the Executive Council decided that in order to ensure that the above amendment to the Statute takes effect, a request may be made to the Hon'ble Chief Justice, High Court of Chhattisgarh and the Chancellor of the University, for his assent. The Executive Council also decided that in order to expedite this matter, the Vice-Chancellor may personally meet the Hon'ble Chancellor.

In view of the above amendment to the Statute made by the Executive Council and the satisfactory services, rather remarkable services, of Prof. (Dr.) Sukh Pal Singh as Vice-Chancellor of the University, the Executive Council recommends to the Hon'ble Chief Justice, High Court of Chhattisgarh and Hon'ble Chancellor of the University to extend the existing tenure of Prof. (Dr.) Sukh Pal Singh, Vice-Chancellor, beyond his initial tenure, for a period of next five years or upto the age of seventy years, whichever is earlier. The abovesaid recommendation of the Executive Council to the Hon'ble Chancellor regarding extension of tenure shall take effect subject to publication of the said amendment in the Official Gazette of the State Government.

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Chhattisgarh and the Chancellor, HNLU on the application of Ms. Sheela Rai, Associate Professor, HNLU, Raipur (now resigned) for grant of relieving certificate, was placed before the Executive Council in its meeting dated 14.12.2013 for its decision.

The Executive Council of the University in its meeting dated 14.12.2013 constituted a sub-committee comprising Hon'ble Mr. Justice Sunil Kumar Sinha, Judge, High Court of Chhattisgarh as the Chairman; Hon'ble Mr. Justice T.P. Sharma, Judge, High Court of Chhattisgarh and Shri A.K. Samant Ray, Principal Secretary, Law Department, Government of Chhattisgarh as Members, to go through in details/facts regarding the matter relating to Dr. Sheela Rai with regard to her appointment, pay fixation, arrears paid to her, local fund audit objections, her request for issue of relieving certificate and decision of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Yatindra Singh, the Chief Justice of Chhattisgarh High Court and the Chancellor of HNLU, Raipur. The Executive Council decided that the University would make available all the relevant documents in indexed form to the sub-committee, from beginning i.e. from advertisement for the post to resignation of Dr. Sheela Rai. The report of the sub-committee shall be circulated to the members of the Executive Council for its ratification and final decision.

As per the decision of the Executive Council meeting dated 14.12.2013, all the relevant documents were made available in indexed form to the sub-committee, from the very beginning i.e. from advertisement for the post to resignation of Dr. Sheela Rai.

The Sub Committee has submitted its report (Copy enclosed - <u>Page</u> Nos. 80 to 86).

The decision of the Sub-Committee in short is as under:-

"Ms. Sheela Rai has already resigned on 22.09.2012 and she had worked on the post of Associate Professor since the date of her appointment till resignation, it would not be appropriate to disturb her 1<sup>st</sup> fixation of pay at Rs.22320/- in the Pay Band of 15600-39100/- at this stage, because it was simply based on the fitment table for the employee holding a particular pay scale at that stage.

The Sub-Committee does not approve the  $2^{nd}$  Fixation in the higher Pay Band of Rs.37400-67000/-, because it was not fixed after as per the eligibility conditions which were required to be satisfied as per the Scheme. The excess amount paid to her in consequence of second re-fixation is liable to be recovered from her after making due calculations treating her earlier fixation dated 06.07.2009 at Rs.22,320/- to be principally correct on the basis of pay received at a particular stage."

The decision of the Sub-Committee is placed before the Executive Council for perusal and decision.

The Executive Council decided that Hon'ble High Court of Chhattisgarh may be informed that eligibility criteria for award of any Gold Medal includes that "there is no proven charge of misconduct on the ground of violation of rules or breach of any disciplinary rules of the University" and that waiver/execution of the order of punishment shall not relieve these students from their proven charges of misconduct.

It was decided that the Hon'ble High Court may further be apprised that the Executive Council has decided not to waive the order of punishment although execution of the order is not possible at this stage and the Executive Council has decided not to award Gold Medals to these students.

# 7. <u>Approval of Confirmation of Employees.</u> Notes:

As per Regulation No.8.2(i) of Chapter II (Appointments) of the HNLU Staff Regulations; the appointments in teaching as well as non-teaching posts are temporary and the incumbent shall be immediately placed on probation for a period mentioned in the respective recruitment rules. The termination of probation and confirmation in the post is only on approval by the Executive Council by a positive order. As per Regulation No. 9(4)(c) of the HNLU Staff Regulations; well before the termination of the period of probation, the Vice-Chancellor shall call for the report of work and conduct from the immediate superior of the employee; and as per Regulation No.9(4)(e) of HNLU Staff Regulations, as soon as possible after completion of the prescribed period of probation, orders of declaration of probation shall be issued by the Registrar based on the report of the certifying officer and approved by the Vice-Chancellor. The certifying officers shall base their decisions on the evaluation reports and such other additional evidence as may be available to them.

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**Dr. Azimkhan B. Pathan**, has been serving this institution since 03.08.2009 as Assistant Lecturer. In March 2014, he suffered from heart problem and needed immediate heart surgery as advised by doctors. Looking to the financial problems faced by him, he has been provided financial assistance of Rs.2,50,000/- (Rupees Two Lacs Fifty Thousand) which includes contribution of Rs.46,165/-(Rupees Forty Six Thousand One Hundred and Sixty Five) made by the faculty members and Rs.2,03,835/- (Rupees Two Lacs Three Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty Five) provided by the University. As per the bills and vouchers submitted by him, the actual expenditure incurred by him is more than Rs.4.00 Lacs (Four Lacs) towards heart surgery, hospitalization, medicines, checkups etc.

In view of this, the matter is placed before the Hon'ble Executive Council of the University to kindly grant ex-postfacto sanction of Rs.2,03,835/- (Rupees Two Lacs Three Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty Five) as above.

**Mr. M.K. Thakre**, has been serving this institution since the year 2005 as Accounts Officer. In May 2014, he has been detected Cancer (oral) and was admitted in Cancer Hospital. He had given an estimate of Rs.1,50,000/- (Rupees One Lac Fifty Thousand) towards operation and treatment. Looking to the financial problems faced by him, he has been provided financial assistance of Rs.75,000/- (Rupees Seventy Five Thousand). He was hospitalized, has been operated and is still undergoing medical treatment at home.

In view of this, the matter is placed before the Hon'ble Executive Council of the University to kindly grant ex-post facto sanction of Rs.75,000/- (Rupees Seventy Five Thousand) as above.

#### **Decision 9(a)**

The Executive Council granted ex-post facto sanction of Rs.2,03,835/- (Rupees Two Lacs Three Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty Five) provided to Mr. Azimkhan B. Pathan as financial assistance towards heart surgery, hospitalization, medicines, checkups etc.

The Executive Council also granted ex-post facto sanction of Rs.75,000/- (Rupees Seventy Five Thousand) provided to Mr. M.K. Thakre as financial assistance towards throat cancer. Apart from this, the Executive Council approved additional

grant of Rs.75,000/- (Rupees Seventy Five Thousand) to Mr. M.K. Thakre for treatment. Thus, the Executive Council sanctioned a total grant of Rs.1,50,000/- (Rupees One Lac Fifty Thousand) to Mr. M.K. Thakre.

# (b) Construction of Auditorium

On the recommendations of the Finance Committee, the Executive Council of the University in its meeting dated 14.12.2013 has accorded its approval to the proposal sent to the State Government for construction of Auditorium at an estimated cost of Rs.17.56 Crores (Rupees Seventeen Crores Fifty Six Lacs).

The State Government vide its letter dated July 2014 has informed that provision of Rs.3.00 Crores (Rupees Three Crores) has been made in the State Government Budget for the F.Y. 2014-15 for construction of Auditorium. During meeting with the State Government Officials, it was proposed that the State Government would accord its approval to the estimates for construction of the auditorium. However, the University would be required to obtain loan for this purpose from a Nationalized Bank and all the EMIs (Equated Monthly Instalments) towards the loan would be paid by the State Government on behalf of the University.

In view of this, the matter is placed before the Executive Council for its approval to proceed for obtaining loan from a Nationalized Bank and Construction of the Auditorium subject to the administrative approval of the State Government, as proposed above.

#### Decision 9(b)

The Executive Council accorded its approval to proceed for obtaining loan from a Nationalized Bank and Construction of a beautiful Auditorium at an estimated cost of Rs.17.56 Crores (Rupees Seventeen Crores Fifty Six Lacs) with ultra modern facilities subject to administrative approval of the State Government as proposed at agenda item No. 9(b).

The Executive Council greeted, congratulated and felicitated Hon'ble Mr. Justice H.L. 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# HIDAYATULLAH NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY STAFF REGULATIONS 2015

## **CHAPTER I**

#### TITLE AND DEFINITIONS

#### 1. Title:

These Regulations shall be called "Hidayatullah National Law University Staff Regulations 2015".

#### 2. Definitions:

In these Regulations unless the context requires otherwise, the following words and phrases have meanings hereby assigned to them:

- (1) 'Absentee' means an employee who absents from duty without obtaining proper sanction of leave from the competent leave sanctioning authority.
- (2) 'Academic Council' means the Academic Council of HNLU.
- (3) 'Act' means the Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh, Act 2003 (No. 10 of 2003).
- (4) 'Average Pay' means the average monthly pay earned during the 12 (Twelve) completed months immediately preceding the month in which the event occurs which necessitates the calculation of the average pay.
- (5) 'Chancellor' means the Chancellor of the University.
- (6) 'Competent Authority' in relation to exercise of any power, means the Executive Council or any authority to which the power is delegated by or under these Regulations.
- (7) 'Completed years of service' or 'one year's continuous service' means continuous service of specified duration under the University and includes the period spent on duty as well as absence on leave including extraordinary leave on Medical Certificate.
- (8) 'Date of Retirement' or 'date of his/her retirement' means the afternoon of the last day of the month in which the University employee attains the age prescribed by or under the terms and conditions governing his/her service.
- (9) 'Day' means a calendar day, beginning and ending at midnight, but an absence from headquarters which does not exceed 24 (Twenty Four) hours shall be reckoned for all purposes as one day, at whatever hours the absence begins or ends.
- (10) 'Duty' includes (i) services as a probationer provided such service is followed by confirmation; and (ii) joining time.
- (11) 'Employee' means a person employed in connection with the work of the University on temporary, adhoc or regular basis for academic or non-academic purposes. Provided that persons who are appointed on adhoc basis for implementing approved research projects shall not be deemed to be employees of the University.
- (12) 'Executive Council' means the Executive Council of the University.
- (13) 'Family' means employee's wife or husband, as the case may be, residing with the employee and legitimate children and step children residing with and wholly dependent upon the employee. It includes, in addition, parents, sisters and minor brothers, if residing with and wholly dependent upon the employee.

Note: Not more than one wife is included in the term 'family' for the purpose of these Regulations.

- (14) 'Holiday' means: Holiday as declared by the competent authority of the University.
- (15) 'Joining time' means the time allowed to an employee in which to join a new post or to travel to or from a station to which he/she is posted.

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- (16) 'Leave Salary' means the monthly amount paid by the University to an employee on leave.
- (17) 'Lien' means the title of University employee to hold substantively, either immediately or on the termination of a period or periods of absence, a substantive post, including a tenure post to which he/she has been appointed substantively.
- (18) 'Pay' means the amount drawn monthly by a University employee as -
  - (i) the pay, other than special pay or pay granted in view of his/her personal qualifications, which has been sanctioned for a post held by him/her substantively or in an officiating capacity, or to which he/she is entitled by reason of his/her position in a cadre, and
  - (ii) Overseas pay, special pay and personal pay, and
  - (iii) any other emoluments which may be specially classed as pay by the Executive Council.
- (19) 'Personal Pay' means additional pay granted to an employee:
  - (a) to save him/her from a loss of substantive pay in respect of a substantive post other than a tenure post due to a revision of pay or to any reduction of such substantive pay otherwise than as a disciplinary measure, or
  - (b) in exceptional circumstances, on other personal considerations.
  - (c) The personal pay will be absorbed in subsequent increase of pay.
- (20) 'Substantive post' means a post carrying a definite rate of pay sanctioned without limit of time.
- (21) 'School' means a Department or a specialized centre established under the University.
- (22) 'Special Pay' means an addition, of the nature of pay, to the emoluments of a post or of an employee, granted in consideration of:
  - (a) the specially arduous nature of the duties; or
  - (b) a specific addition to the work or responsibility, and includes nonpracticing allowance sanctioned to a practicing professional.
- (23) 'Temporary post' means a post carrying a definite rate of pay sanctioned for a limited period.
- (24) 'Tenure Post' means a post which an individual may not hold for more than a limited period without re-appointment or extension.
- (25) 'Time-Scale of Pay' means scale of pay which rises by periodical increments from a minimum to a maximum.
- (26) 'University employee in regular employment means an employee who holds substantively a substantive post or who holds a lien on a substantive post or who would have held a lien or substantive post had the lien not been suspended.
- (27) 'University' means the Hidayatullah National Law University, Chhattisgarh.
- (28) 'Vice-Chancellor' means the Vice-Chancellor of the Hidayatullah National Law University.
- (29) 'Visitor' means the Visitor of Hidayatullah National Law University.
- (30) 'Year':
  - (i) Academic year: A 12 month (Twelve month) period during which a cycle of academic work is to be completed:
  - (ii) Financial year: A 12 month (Twelve month) period commencing from 1<sup>st</sup> April of a year and ending on 31<sup>st</sup> March of the succeeding year.



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## CHAPTER – II

#### **APPOINTMENTS**

#### 3. / Number of Posts:

Subject to Statute 9 read with Section 12 of the Act, the number of posts under each category of employees of the University shall be such as may be determined by the Executive Council from time to time on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor.

#### 4. Posts, Grade of pay and other allowances/facilities:

(1) Posts: The posts of Vice-Chancellor, Registrar, Finance Officer and Controller of Examinations are statutory posts and all the remaining posts are to be created by the Executive Council from time to time on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor.

(2) Pay of Vice-Chancellor: The grade of pay of the Vice-Chancellor shall be in conformity with the grade of pay of the Vice-Chancellors of the Central Universities of India as revised and updated as per the relevant rules notified from time to time for the purpose with D.A. and other allowances as per Central Government norms alongwith complete medical bill reimbursement to him/her and his/her dependants. Also free furnished housing accommodation maintained by the University is to be provided to the Vice-Chancellor with telephone, transport facilities etc. etc. which are usually provided to the Head of any national institution. The Executive Council shall however have the power to revise pay & perks or grant some other facilities for the Vice-Chancellor.

(3) Grades of Pay of employees other than teachers: The grades of pay of all other employees other than the teachers shall be determined by the Executive Council on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor. While doing so, pay scales recommended by the Central Government with corresponding Central Government allowances shall be adopted.

(4) Grades of Pay of teachers: In respect of teachers, the grades of pay shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor in conformity with the UGC pay scales prevalent from time to time.

Provided that the Executive Council may at any time, revise the sanctioned grade of pay of any post.

Provided further that such revision shall not prejudicially affect the interest of any employee.

All the employees shall get a monthly fixed medical allowance @ 5% (Five percent) of their basic pay but not exceeding the ceiling limit of Rs.750/- per month (Rupees Seven Hundred Fifty per month). However, in cases such as cancer, heart surgery, kidney transplantation, severe injuries caused by accident etc., the Executive Council on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor may consider providing a lump sum grant for treatment of the employee concerned.

#### 5. Qualifications for Posts:

- a. The Executive Council in consultation with the Chancellor may determine the qualifications for the post of Vice-Chancellor.
- b. The qualifications for the posts of UGC designated teaching posts shall be as prescribed by the UGC from time to time.
- c. The qualifications for the post of other non-UGC designated teaching posts, Officers, Administrative, Ministerial and non-teaching staff and employees shall be determined by the Executive Council based on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor.

#### Tenure of Appointments:

6.

In accordance with the UGC norms prescribed from time to time appointments may be made:

- a. Either for a specific period on contract basis, which shall be on such terms as may be agreed upon by the Executive Council and the person concerned and the same may, at the discretion of the Executive Council, be renewed any number of times: or
- b. On regular basis till the age of superannuation against a substantive post.

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#### 7. Age of Appointment:

The age of a person at the time of appointment to the service of the University shall ordinarily be not less than 18 (eighteen) years and not more than 40 (forty) years in respect of administrative and ministerial staff and 60 (sixty) years in respect of officers (other than the Vice-Chancellor) and teachers provided that the Executive Council shall have the discretion to relax or waive these limits whenever it considers necessary in the interest of the University.

#### 8. 8.1. Selection Committee:

Appointments of the teaching and non-teaching staff, on tenure or non-tenure basis, shall be made on the basis of the recommendations of the Selection Committee constituted in such manner as prescribed under these Regulations.

(a) Selection Committees for appointment of Registrar and Finance Officer shall be constituted as prescribed in the University Act and/or Regulations.

(b) Selection Committees for appointment of teaching employees of the University (on UGC designated posts) shall be constituted as prescribed by UGC from time to time.

(c) Selection Committees for appointment of teaching employees of the University (on posts other than UGC designated posts) shall consist of:-

(i) The Vice-Chancellor, Chairman

(ii) One member nominated by the Vice-Chancellor

(iii) Two subject experts from outside the University, nominated by the Vice-Chancellor

(d) Selection Committees for appointment of non-teaching employees (excluding Registrar and Finance Officer) of the University shall consist of the following members:

(i) The Vice-Chancellor; Chairman

(ii) One member nominated by the Vice-Chancellor

(iii) The Registrar of the University.

#### 8.2 Appointments:

(i) The persons appointed through direct recruitment on teaching & non-teaching substantive posts shall be immediately placed on probation for a period mentioned in these regulations.

(ii) All substantive posts shall be advertised in the official website of the University and in addition, advertisement may also be published in Two National Newspapers having wide circulation.

(iii) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, the Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to appoint Visiting Professors and adhoc teaching and non-teaching Officers and employees either on full time basis or as an additional duty as and when required on such terms and conditions including payment of additional duty allowance as the Vice-Chancellor deems fit.

#### 8.3 Mode of Appointment

#### (1) The Vice-Chancellor

(a) The Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor as per the provisions of Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh Act, 2003.

(b) On the basis of satisfactory services, well before the expiry of normal tenure, the Executive Council of the University may recommend to the Chancellor of the University to extend the existing tenure of the Vice-Chancellor, beyond his/her initial tenure, for a period of next five years and the Chancellor shall have the power to grant such extension of the existing tenure of the Vice-Chancellor, provided that such extension of tenure of the Vice-Chancellor can be upto the age of seventy years only. Provided further, that upon the expiry of his/her term, the Vice-Chancellor shall continue to remain in office until his/her successor is appointed and enters upon his/her office.

In order to ensure certainty about the next Vice-Chancellor, such recommendation be made by the Executive Council reasonably well before the expiry of the normal tenure of the Vice-Chancellor.



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#### (2) Registrar

(a) The Executive Council shall constitute a Selection Committee, for the appointment of Registrar, of which the Vice-Chancellor shall be the Chairman and two experts from outside the University nominated by the Vice-Chancellor from amongst a panel of names proposed by the Vice-Chancellor and approved by the Executive Council.

(b) Registrar may be appointed either on a regular basis or for a specified term.

(c)The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power either to appoint Registrar (Incharge) from amongst the regular faculty members or officers of the University on full time basis or assign the work to him/her as an additional duty on such terms and conditions including payment of additional duty allowance as the Vice-Chancellor deems fit.

# (3) Finance Officer

There shall be a Finance Officer who shall be appointed as may be prescribed in the Act and Regulations.

#### (4) Controller of Examinations

The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power either to appoint Controller of Examinations (Incharge) from amongst the regular faculty members or officers of the University on full time basis or assign the work to him/her as an additional duty on such terms and conditions including payment of additional duty allowance as the Vice-Chancellor deems fit.

(5) Wardens of the Hostels of the University: The Vice-Chancellor may assign the duty of Warden(s) to any member(s) of faculty as additional duty on such terms and conditions including payment of additional duty allowance as the Vice-Chancellor deems fit.

#### (6) Officers, Teaching and Non-Teaching Employees:

The Officers, Teaching and Non-Teaching employees of the University shall be appointed on substantive posts in the manner as prescribed in these Regulations.

#### 9(1) Proof of Date of Birth

Every person newly appointed in the University shall produce SSLC or Matriculation Certificate, for proving his/her date of birth.

On the acceptance of the date of birth, it shall be entered in the service records of the person concerned to be authenticated both by the employer and person concerned and shall not be altered under any circumstances.

#### 9(2) Agreement of Service:

Every employee of the University, other than the Vice-Chancellor appointed to any substantive post or to such other posts as may be determined by the Executive Council from time to time shall sign an agreement of service in the prescribed form accepting in writing the terms and conditions of appointment before joining duty.

#### 9(3) Commencement of Service:

All appointments shall take effect from the dates on which the appointee reports himself/herself for duty at the University or the place prescribed in his/her appointment order.

#### 9(4) Probation:

(a) Every person appointed through direct recruitment/appointment in the University against substantive posts, other than those appointed by invitation, unless otherwise provided for in the appointment order of the person concerned, shall be placed on probation for a period of two years which may be further extendable. In computing the period of probation, extraordinary leave, if any, granted to an employee on probation shall be excluded.



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- (b) There will be no automatic confirmation. It can only be done by specific order. The completion of probation period and confirmation to the post is only on approval by the Executive Council by a positive order.
- (c) On completion of probation period, the Vice-Chancellor shall call for the report of work and conduct from the immediate superior of the employee. The immediate superior shall base his/her decision on evaluation reports and such other additional evidences as may be available to him/her. Immediate superior means:

(i) The Vice-Chancellor in respect of all Teachers including Heads of Departments/Schools and Officers.

(ii) Heads of Departments or Schools in respect of all teachers and service personnel, if any, working in their respective Schools or departments provided such Departments/Schools exist in the University.

(iii) Registrar in respect of administrative, clerical and ministerial staff/employees.

Based on the report of the immediate superior and approval thereof by the Vice-Chancellor, if, at the end of the period of probation, the work and conduct of the employee is found satisfactory, the matter of the employee regarding completion of the probation period and his/her confirmation to the post shall be placed before the Executive Council. After approval of the Executive Council, orders of completion of probation and confirmation to the post shall be issued by the Registrar.

If, at the end of the period of probation, the work and/or conduct of the employee is/are found unsatisfactory, the services of the employee may be terminated or the period of probation may be extended by the Executive Council on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor.

- (d) Any extension of the period of probation shall not be longer than one year and there shall be only one such extension.
- (e) If the work of an employee is found to be unsatisfactory even after the extended period of probation, the Executive Council may terminate the services of the employee on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor.
- (f) Any delay in the issue of an order extending the period of probation shall not entitle an employee to claim that he/she has satisfactorily completed such probation period.
- (g) An employee shall be eligible for the grant of annual increments in the time scale after satisfactory completion of the probation period.
- (h) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions, if a probationer's work or conduct is found unsatisfactory, his/her services can be terminated by the appointing authority by giving one month's notice.

#### 9(5) Career Advancement of Teachers:

The UGC rules amended from time to time for Career Advancement may be made applicable for the teachers working in the University.

#### 10. Confirmation:

No person appointed through direct recruitment/appointment shall be confirmed on a substantive post unless he/she has successfully completed the prescribed probation period.

#### 11. Superannuation:

(1) The age of superannuation of the Vice-Chancellor shall be 70 years (seventy years).

(2) The age of superannuation of teachers shall be 65 years (sixty five years).

(3) The age of superannuation of Officers and non-teaching employees shall be 62 years (sixty two years).

(4) However, it shall be open to the University to re-employ a superannuated teaching/nonteaching employee beyond the age of superannuation on mutually accepted terms and conditions.



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# 12. Agreement:

All the teaching and non-teaching officers and employees appointed on substantive posts, except the Vice-Chancellor, shall enter into a written agreement with the University. The form of agreement to be executed is given in the annexure and the same may be amended and updated from time to time.

#### 13. Lien:

When an employee of the University confirmed on a substantive post is subsequently appointed on another substantive post on probation, he/she may be sanctioned lien on the former post for the entire period of probation/till his/her confirmation on the new substantive post. The authority competent to sanction lien in such cases shall be the Vice-Chancellor of the University.

#### 14. Resignation:

The employees appointed on substantive posts may resign from their posts only after giving three months prior notice to the University or upon depositing three months salary in lieu thereof. Relaxation to this rule may be made at the discretion of the Vice-Chancellor.

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## CHAPTER – III

#### **LEAVE**

#### 15. General

All employees of the University other than those paid out of contingencies shall be governed by the following leave rules/regulations.

#### 16. Right to Leave:

Leave cannot be claimed as a matter of right. Leave is earned by duty only. If the exigencies of University services require, discretion to refuse or revoke leave already sanctioned rests with the competent authority.

#### 17. Kinds of Leave:

- (A) Earned Leave
- (B) Half-Pay Leave
- (C) Commuted Leave
- (D) Extraordinary Leave Without Pay
- (E) Maternity Leave/Paternity Leave
- (F) Casual Leave.

#### (A) EARNED LEAVE:

- (i) A non-vacation employee shall earn thirty days leave in one calendar year. The leave account of every employee shall be credited with earned leave in advance, in instalments of 15 days (fifteen days) Earned Leave on the first day of January and July. Earned Leave shall accrue at the rate of 2½ days (two and half days) for each completed calendar month of service.
- (ii) The leave at the credit of an employee at the close of previous half year shall be carried forward to the following years subject to the condition that the leave so accumulated shall not exceed the maximum limit of 300 days (three hundred days).
- (iii) Period spent in foreign service shall count as duty for purpose of this rule only if contribution towards leave salary had been made for such period.
- (iv) The maximum earned leave that may be allowed at a time to an employee shall not exceed 180 days (one hundred eighty days). Any further extension may be allowed by the Executive Council only in deserving cases.
- (v) A non-vacation employee shall be entitled to an equal number of compensatory leave if he/she is required to work on holidays.
- (B) HALF PAY LEAVE
- (i) The half-pay leave shall be credited at the rate of 10 days (ten days) each, on the first day of January and July in every calendar year.
- (ii) (a) The leave shall be credited to the said leave account at the rate of 5/3 days for each completed calendar month of service.
  - (b) When an employee is removed or dismissed from service or dies in service, credit of half-pay leave shall be allowed at the rate of 5/3 days per completed calendar month upto the end of the calendar month in which he/she is removed or dismissed from service or dies in service.
- (iii) The leave under this rule may be granted on medical certificates or on personal grounds.
- (iv) While affording credit of half-pay leave, fraction of a day shall be rounded off to the nearest day.

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Provided that in the case of an employee not in regular employ or quasi-regular employ, no half-pay leave shall be granted unless the authority competent to grant leave has reasons to believe that the employee would return to duty on its expiry except in the case of an employee who has been declared completely and permanently incapacitated for further service by a medical authority.

#### (C) COMMUTED LEAVE:

Commuted leave not exceeding half the amount of half-pay leave due may be granted to an employee subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The authority competent to grant leave is satisfied that there is reasonable prospect of the employee returning to duty on its expiry.
- (ii) When commuted leave is granted, twice the amount of such leave shall be debited against the half-pay leave due.
- (iii) Commuted leave during the entire service shall be limited to a maximum of 240 days (two hundred forty days). The maximum commuted leave on personal ground that may be granted at a time shall not exceed 120 days (one hundred twenty days). If commuted leave is combined with earned leave the total period should not exceed 180 days (one hundred eighty days).
- (iv) The total duration of earned leave and commuted leave on personal grounds taken in conjunction shall not exceed 240 days (two hundred forty days).
- (v) An employee on half-pay leave or on commuted leave is entitled to leave salary equal to half the pay or full pay as the case may be on the basis of last pay drawn by him/her before proceeding on leave he/she would be entitled to had he/she not gone on leave. An employee on half-pay leave is entitled to salary equal to half of the pay he/she would be entitled to had he/she not gone on leave will be entitled to pay he/she would be entitled to had he/she not gone on leave.
- (vi) Where an employee has been granted commuted leave resigns from service or at his/her request permitted to retire voluntarily without returning to duty, the commuted leave shall be treated as half-pay leave and the difference between the leave salary in respect of commuted leave and half-pay leave shall be recovered. Provided that no such recovery shall be made if the retirement is by reason of illhealth incapacitating the employee for further service or in the event of his/her death.

#### (D) EXTRAORDINARY LEAVE WITHOUT PAY:

- (I) Extraordinary leave may be granted to an employee under special circumstances-
  - (a) when no other leave is admissible.
  - (b) when other leave is admissible but the employee applied in writing for the grant of extraordinary leave.
- (II) The authority competent to grant leave may commute retrospectively periods of absence without leave into extraordinary leave.
- (III) An employee on extraordinary leave is not entitled to any leave salary.

#### (E) MATERNITY LEAVE/PATERNITY LEAVE:

- (I) A female employee may be granted maternity leave by the authority competent to grant leave for a period of 180 days (one hundred eighty days) from the date of its commencement. During such period, she shall be paid leave salary equal to the pay drawn immediately before proceeding on leave.
- (II) Maternity leave may also be granted in case of miscarriage, including abortion, subject to the conditions that-
  - (a) the leave does not exceed six weeks:
  - (b) the application for the leave is supported by a medical certificate of an

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- (III) Maternity leave may be combined with leave of any other kind.
- (IV) Maternity leave shall not be debited against the leave account.
- (V) A male employee may be granted paternity leave by the authority competent to grant leave for a period of 15 days (fifteen days). During the period, he shall be paid leave salary equal to the pay being drawn by him. The paternity leave may also be granted for cases as mentioned at (II) above. The paternity leave may be combined with leave of any other kind. Paternity leave shall not be debited against the leave account.

Provided that no maternity or paternity leave shall be granted if the spouses have two or more children alive.

# (F) CASUAL LEAVE:

Casual leave may be granted to all employees of the University for 8 (eight) days in each calendar year. Casual leave to temporary staff will be granted in the same manner as to those holding regular appointments.

Casual leave shall be granted only for casual purposes when it can be given without inconvenience to University services.

It shall not be combined with other leave but may be prefixed or suffixed with holidays. Not more than three days casual leave exclusive of such Sundays and holidays shall be taken during one period of absence and also provided that such period of absence shall not exceed six days in all. Half-day Casual leave may also be granted to the employees.

#### 18. Leave to Probationer - a person on probation:

- (a) A person appointed to a substantive post on probation shall be entitled to leave only to the extent of leave at his/her credit.
- (b) If, for any reason, it is proposed to terminate the services of a probationer, any leave which may be granted to him/her shall not exceed -
  - (i) beyond the date on which the probation period lasts or extended expires, or
  - beyond any earlier date on which his/her services are likely to be terminated by an authority competent to appoint him/her.
  - (iii) A person appointed to a substantive post on probation shall be entitled to leave under these rules as a temporary or a regular employee according to the condition as to whether his/her appointment is against a temporary or a substantive post.

Provided that where such a person already holds a lien on a substantive post before such appointment, he/she shall be entitled to leave under these rules as a regular employee.


#### 19. Persons re-employed after retirement:

In the case of a person re-employed after retirement, the provisions of these rules shall apply, as if he/she had entered the University services for the first time on the day of his/her re-employment.

#### 20. Leave preparatory to retirement:

An employee may be permitted by the authority competent to grant leave to take leave preparatory to retirement to the extent of earned leave due, not exceeding 300 days (three hundred days) together with half-pay leave due, subject to the condition that such leave extends upto and includes the date of retirement.

Note: The leave granted as leave preparatory to retirement shall not include extraordinary leave.



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21. Encashment of Leave/Cash payment in lieu of leave beyond the date of retirement or quitting of service:

(i) No leave shall be granted to an employee beyond -

- (a) the date of his/her retirement, or
- (b) the date of his/her final cessation of duties, or
- (c) the date on which he/she retires by giving notice to the University or he/she is retired by the University by giving him/her notice or pay and allowances in lieu of such notice, in accordance with the terms and conditions of his/her service or
- (d) the date of resignation from service.

(ii)

- (a) Where an employee retires on attaining the normal age prescribed for retirement under the terms and conditions governing his/her service, the authority competent to grant leave shall suo motu grant cash equivalent of leave salary for earned leave/half pay leave if any, at the credit of the employee on the date of his/her retirement, subject to a maximum of 300 days (three hundred days). However, commutation of half pay leave shall not be admissible while encashment of half pay leave.
- (b) The cash equivalent under Clause (a) shall be calculated as follows and shall be payable in one lump sum as a one-time settlement. No House Rent Allowance or City Compensatory Allowance shall be payable.

- (iii) The authority competent to grant leave may withhold whole or part of cash equivalent of earned leave/half pay leave in the case of an employee who retires from service on obtaining the age of retirement while under suspension or while discipline or criminal proceedings are pending against him/her, if in the view of such authority there is a possibility of some money becoming recoverable from him/her, on conclusion of the proceedings against him/her. On conclusion of the proceedings, he/she will become eligible to the amount so withheld after adjustment of University dues, if any.
- (iv) Where the services of an employee have been extended, in the interest of the University, beyond the date of his/her retirement, he may be granted -
  - (a) during the period of extension, any earned leave/half pay leave due in respect of the period of such extension plus the earned leave/half pay leave which was at his/her credit on the date of his/her retirement.
  - (b) after the expiry of the period of extension, cash equivalent in the manner provided in sub-rule 21(ii) in respect of earned leave at credit on the day of retirement plus the earned leave/half pay leave earned during the period of extension, reduced by the earned leave availed of during such period, subject to a maximum of 300 days (three hundred days).
- (v) A University employee who retires or is retired from service in the manner mentioned in Clause (c) of sub-rule 21(i), may be granted, suo motu, by the authority competent to grant leave, cash equivalent of the leave salary in respect of earned leave/half pay leave at his/her credit subject to a maximum of 300 days (three hundred days). The cash equivalent shall be equal to leave salary as admissible for earned leave/half pay leave and/or equal to the leave salary as



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admissible for half-pay leave plus dearness allowance admissible on that leave salary for maximum 300 days at the rates in force on the date the employee so retires or is retired and ad-hoc relief/granted shall be deducted from the leave salary paid for the period of half-pay leave, if any, for which the cash equivalent is payable. The amount so calculated shall be paid in one lump sum as a one-time settlement.

- (vi) (a) (i) Where the services of an employee are terminated by notice or by payment of pay and allowances in lieu of notice, or otherwise in accordance with the terms and conditions of his/her appointment, he/she may be granted, suo motu by the authority competent to grant leave, cash equivalent in respect of earned leave/half pay leave at his/her credit on the date on which he/she ceases to be in service subject to a maximum of 300 days (three hundred days).
  - (ii) If an employee resigns or quits service, he/she may be granted, suo motu, by the authority competent to grant leave, cash equivalent in respect of earned leave/half pay leave at his/her credit on the date of cessation of service, to the extent of half of such leave at his/her credit, subject to a maximum of 150 days (one hundred fifty days).
  - (iii) An employee, who is re-employed after retirement, may on termination of his/her re-employment, be granted suo motu, by the authority competent to grant leave cash equivalent in respect of earned leave/half pay leave at his/her credit on the date of termination of re-employment subject to a maximum of 300 days (three hundred days) (including the period for which encashment was allowed at the time of retirement).
  - (b) The cash equivalent payable under Clause (vi)(a) shall be calculated in the manner indicated in Clause (b) of sub-rule 21(ii) and for the purpose of computation of cash equivalent under sub-clause (iii) of Clause (vi)(a), the pay on the date of the termination of re-employment shall be the pay fixed in the scale of post of re-employment before adjustment of pension equivalent of other retirement benefits and the dearness allowance appropriate to that pay.

#### 22. Leave Rules for vacation enjoying employees:

- (1) A teacher is entitled to not less than six weeks of vacation in an academic year during the periods so declared by the University.
- (2) One week before the closure of the semester, the Registrar shall notify the commencement and the ending of the vacation between the semesters.
- (3) All teachers of the University shall be treated as those enjoying vacation and as such they are not entitled to any kind of Earned Leave in respect of duty performed in any academic year, except in the manner as specified hereunder:

If in any academic year a teacher is required by a general or special order of the Vice-Chancellor to forego such vacation or a portion of a vacation in the interest of the University work, he/she shall be entitled to:

An earned leave at the rate of one day for every three days of vacation, and such earned leave could be accumulated upto a maximum of 300 days (three hundred days) in one's period of service in the University

OR

'Compensatory Leave' of equal number of days foregone during the vacation

(4) An employee enjoying vacation is entitled to 7 days (seven days) Half Pay Leave each year.



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- Leave rules for employees appointed on adhoc, temporary and consolidated salary basis in the University":
  - A. These rules shall apply to employees who are appointed on adhoc, temporary and consolidated salary basis.
  - B. The kinds of leave and leave entitlement shall be as follows:

shall be deducted from the salary due to him/her.

- (a) For employees who have completed one year of service
  - (i) Casual Leave : 8 days (Eight days) in a calendar year.
    - Earned Leave : 15 days (fifteen days) to be credited in advance on 1st January
  - (iii) Compensatory : If an employee is required to work on Leave Sundays/general holidays, compensatory leave to the extent of the number of such days shall be credited to his/her leave account.
- (b)

(ii)

For employees during the first year of service.(i) Casual leave : 8 days (Eight days) in a calendar year.

If an employee appointed on adhoc basis, temporary basis and consolidated salary basis, leaves the services of the University or if an employee's services are terminated by the University, the Earned Leave entitlement will be regulated at the rate of 1¼ days (One and one-fourth days) per calendar month completed and the salary to the extent of excess availed of earned leave if any as on the date of relief,

- C. General:
  - 1. Leave cannot be claimed as a matter of right and the leave sanctioning authority may refuse and revoke sanctioned leave.

2. No encashment of Leave is permitted during continuation of service.

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#### **CHAPTER - IV**

## CONTRIBUTORY PROVIDENT FUND AND GRATUITY

### 24. Contributory Provident Fund:

The provisions of Employees' Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 are statutorily applicable to the University. Accordingly, the University has adopted the Contributory Provident Fund Scheme for the employees of the University as per provisions contained in the EPF & MP Act, 1952.

#### 25. Gratuity

The provisions of Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972 are statutorily applicable to the University. For discharge of employer's liability, the University has obtained Compulsory Insurance from LIC as per provisions of the Act. Gratuity is payable to the employees of the University as per provisions of the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972.

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#### CHAPTER - V

## MEDICAL BENEFITS TO EMPLOYEES

- 26. All the employees of the University shall receive a monthly fixed medical allowance @ 5% (five percent) of their basic pay but not exceeding the ceiling limit of Rs.750/- per month (Rupees Seven Hundred Fifty per month)
- 27. However, in exceptional cases such as cancer, heart surgery, kidney transplantation, severe injuries caused by accident etc., the Executive Council on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor may consider providing a lump sum grant for treatment of the employee concerned.
- 28. The employees holding substantive posts can contribute to and become members of the Group Savings Linked Insurance Scheme of LIC subscribed to by the University.

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#### CHAPTER - VI

## - TRAVELLING AND DAILY ALLOWANCES

#### For Officers, Teachers and other employees of the University: 29.

For purpose of travelling and daily allowance the employees of the University are 1. classified as follows:

### Daily Allowances and accommodation:

The D.A. and entitlement for accommodation for official work shall be admissible to the employees as is admissible to Central Government employees from time to time.

#### General: 30.

3.

- The Air/Train Fares payable shall be by the shortest route.
- a. The daily allowance for journey periods shall be restricted for the minimum b. possible time absolutely required to complete the journeys to and fro by the shortest route.

An employee who takes casual leave while on tour on University work or extends с. stay for non-availability of accommodation in train etc. is not entitled for any daily allowance for such extended stay.

#### **Powers of Vice-Chancellor:** 31.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the above Regulations the Vice-Chancellor shall have power to authorize Air Travel by economy class to an employee only in cases of extreme urgency.

#### T.A. and D.A. for attending Conferences, Seminars, Workshops etc. 32.

Notwithstanding anything contained above, Teachers and other employees sponsored by the University to attend Conferences, Seminars, and Workshops etc. shall be entitled for the payment of only A.C. II Train fare to and fro and a Daily allowance at the rate as is applicable as per UGC guidelines, amended and updated from time to time, besides the registration fee, if any.



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#### CHAPTER – VII

## DISCIPLINARY RULES AND APPLICABILITY OF PROVISIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS OF CHHATTISGARH STATE GOVERNMENT TO EMPLOYEES OF THE UNIVERSITY

33. (1) Every employee of the University shall devote himself/herself diligently and honestly to the University's work and his/her services shall be available whole time at the disposal of the University, which is a residential University. He/she shall not without previous sanction of the University engage in any trade or undertake any employment during his/her service either directly or indirectly carry on any business/trade/private tuitions etc. etc.

(2) Nothing in Clause (1) shall preclude him/her from writing books or engaging in a work of literary or scientific or artistic nature or social service provided his/her regular duties do not suffer thereby.

(3) While engaged in matters referred to in Clauses (1) & (2) every employee of the University shall intimate any remuneration received to the Registrar of the University.

34. No employee of the University shall be a member of any association, whose primary aims are contrary to the objects of University.

## 35. SUSPENSION, PENALTIES & DISCIPLINARY AUTHORITY:

- (1) The competent authority may by an order place an employee under suspension:
- (a) when disciplinary proceedings against him/her are contemplated or pending, or
- (b) where a case against him/her in respect of any criminal offence is under investigation, inquiry or trial.
- (c) when an employee absents from duty without proper sanction of leave from competent leave sanctioning authority for a period exceeding thirty days unauthorized leave.

(2) An employee shall be deemed to have been placed under suspension by an order of the appointing authority.

- (a) with effect from the date of his/her detention, if he/she is detained in custody, whether on a criminal charge involving moral turpitude or otherwise for a period exceeding forty eight hours.
- (b) with effect from the date of his/her conviction for an offence, and sentenced to a term of imprisonment exceeding forty eight hours and is not forthwith dismissed or removed or compulsorily retired consequent upon such conviction.

(3) An order of suspension made or deemed to have been made shall continue to remain in force until it is modified or revoked by the appointing authority.

(4) Where an employee is suspended or is deemed to have been suspended (whether in connection with any disciplinary proceeding or otherwise) and any other disciplinary proceeding is recommended against him/her during the continuance of the suspension, the authority competent to place him/her under suspension may, for reasons to be recorded by him/her in writing, direct that the employee shall continue to be under suspension until the termination of all or any of such proceedings.



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- 36. (1) The competent authority may, for good and sufficient reasons, impose on an employee the following penalties:-
  - (a) Censure
  - (b) Recovery from his/her pay of the whole or part of any pecuniary loss caused by him/her to the University by negligence or breach of orders.
  - (c) Withholding of increment of pay.
  - (d) Reduction to lower time scale of pay, grade or post.
  - (e) Compulsory Retirement.
  - (f) Removal from service.
  - (g) Dismissal from service which shall ordinarily be a disqualification for future employment in the University.

(2) The competent authority may institute disciplinary proceeding against an employee of the University.

(3) No order imposing any of the penalties specified in subparagraph (1) shall be made except in accordance with the procedure for imposing penalties as prescribed by Government of Chhattisgarh and in force at the time when the competent authority orders an inquiry against the employee concerned.

37. (1) Where any penalty is imposed on an employee by the Registrar, the employee concerned may prefer an appeal to the Executive Council within thirty days from the date on which a copy of the order appealed against is delivered to the appellant.

(2) Where any penalty is imposed on an employee by the Executive Council, he/she may prefer an appeal to the Chancellor within thirty days from the date on which a copy of the order appealed is delivered to the appellant.

(3) The memo of appeal shall accompany a copy of the order appealed against. It shall contain all material statements and arguments on which the appellant proposes to prefer appeal.

(4) The authority which made the order appealed against shall on receipt of a copy of the appeal, forward the same with its comments thereon together with the relevant record to the appellate authority, without any avoidable delay and without waiting for any direction from appellate authority.

(5) (i) The appellate authority may confirm, enhance, reduce or set aside the penalty or remit the case to the authority which imposed the penalty with such direction as it may deem fit in the circumstances of the case.

(ii) The authority which made the order appealed against shall give effect to the orders passed by the appellate authority.

- 38. A University employee under suspension shall not be entitled to any leave.
- 39. (a) An employee under suspension shall be entitled during the first year of suspension to subsistence allowance at the rate of half of the amount of salary and D.A. which he/she is drawing on the date of suspension provided that where the period of suspension extends beyond one year, the authority shall increase the amount of subsistence allowance to 75% (seventy five percent) of pay and D.A. If the period of suspension had been prolonged for reasons not attributable to the delinquent, the subsistence allowance shall be increased to 100% (hundred percent) of the pay last drawn by him/her.
  - (b) He/she shall also be entitled to D.A. and Medical allowances as payable to serving employees.



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- 40. When a University employee who has been dismissed or removed from service or suspended, is reinstated, the authority competent to order reinstatement shall make a specific order.
  - (a) regarding the pay and allowance to be paid for the period of suspension, and for the period of dismissal/removal; and
  - (b) whether or not the said period shall be treated as period spent on duty for all purposes.
- 41. Every employee shall at all times:
  - (a) Maintain absolute integrity
  - (b) show devotion to duty, and
  - (c) do nothing which is unbecoming of an employee of the University.
- 42. No employee shall join or continue to be a member of such association, the objects or activities of which are prejudicial to the interests of the University or public order, or morality.
- 43. No employee shall:
  - (i) Engage himself/herself or participate in any demonstration which is prejudicial to the interests of the University, public decency or morality or which involves contempt of Court, defamation or incitement to an offence.
  - (ii) Resort to or, in any way, abet any form of violence in connection with any matter pertaining to his/her service or the service of an employee.
- 44. No employee shall except with the previous permission of the University or any competent authority contribute any article or write any letter either in his/her own name or anonymously, pseudonymously in any newspaper or period or write a book. Provided that such permission shall not be required if such broadcast or contribution or writing is of a purely literary, artistic or scientific character.
- 45. No employee shall except in accordance with any general or special order of the University or in the performance in good faith of the duties assigned to him/her provide/communicate directly or indirectly, an official document or any part thereof or any information to any other employee or any other person to whom he/she is not authorized to provide/communicate such document or information.
- 46. No employee shall bring or attempt to bring any political or other influence to bear upon any superior authority to further his/her interest in respect of matters pertaining to his/her service under the University.
- 47. No University employee shall, except with the previous written sanction of the University, join any college/school or appear at any examination conducted by the University or in any other University or Board.

Permission to attend classes or take an examination will be granted only, if it is consistent with University's interest and it cannot be claimed as a matter of right.

48. (1) No University employee except those specifically employed on a part-time basis shall without the previous permission of the University, apply for any post outside the University.

(2) No employee of the University shall apply directly or indirectly for any post outside the University except through the Vice-Chancellor. Not more than three such applications shall be forwarded in one calendar year.

(3) No employee of the University shall take up any job or assignment without written permission from the Vice-Chancellor of the University.



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49. Any infringement of the provisions of above paras pertaining to disciplinary rules shall be regarded as subversive of good discipline and misconduct and will well justify initiation of disciplinary action against such employee.

50. In addition to HNLU Staff Regulations, Chhattisgarh Civil Service Rules and Chhattisgarh Government Fundamental Rules shall be applicable for teaching and non-teaching employees of the University and wherever there is ambiguity/contradiction between HNLU Staff Regulations and Civil Service/Fundamental Rules, the latter shall prevail.

51. Chhattisgarh State Government Calendar shall be followed for Gazetted and other holidays for non-vacation employees of the University.

## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Memorandum of Agreement made this the \_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_ between Mr./Ms./Dr. \_\_\_\_\_\_ (hereinafter called 'Employee') of the First Part and the Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh, being a University enacted under the Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh Act 2003 (No. 10 of 2003) (hereinafter called the 'University') of the Second Part.

1. That the University hereby appoints Mr./Ms./Dr. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_as \_\_\_\_\_\_\_in the University with effect from the date the said \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ in the University with effect from the date the said \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ hereby accepts the engagement and undertakes to take such part and perform such duties in the University as may be required by and in accordance with the Act, the Schedule and Regulations, for the time being in force, of the University, whether the same relate to organization of instruction or the examination of students or their discipline or their welfare and generally to act under the direction of the officers and authorities of the University.

2. That the teaching/non-teaching employee shall be placed on probation for the period specified under the Regulations. After the period of probation the teaching/non-teaching employee shall not have any automatic claim for confirmation to the post. At the end of the probation period, the University may renew and continue the contract/probation period as per the Regulations. The age of superannuation shall be as prescribed under the Regulations.

3. That the said \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ shall be a whole-time teaching/non-teaching employee of the University and is liable to be transferred or assigned other duties under the University, if necessary;

4. That the University shall pay the said employee a basic pay of Rs.\_\_\_\_\_

\_\_\_\_\_with Grade Pay of Rs.\_\_\_\_\_in the pay band of Rs.\_\_\_\_

besides the Dearness Allowances and other allowances/facilities as determined by the Executive Council from time to time;

5. That the said employee agrees to be bound by the provisions of the Act, the Regulations and Rules in force from time to time in the University and in particular by those relating to the service conditions as indicated in the order of appointment;

6. That the teaching/non-teaching employee shall devote his/her whole time to the service of the University, and shall not without the permission of the University, engage, directly or indirectly, in any trade or business whatsoever, or in any private tuition or other work to which any emolument or honorarium is attached; but this prohibition shall not apply to work undertaken with prior permission of the Vice-chancellor, in connection with the examinations of Universities, or Public Service Commissions or any other examination of literary and academic/research work and publications thereof.

7. (1) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Executive Council of the University shall be entitled to terminate the employment of the teaching/non-teaching employee on the ground of misconduct in accordance with the provisions contained in the Regulations.



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(2) The Vice-Chancellor may, when he/she finds it necessary in the interest of the University, suspend the teaching/non-teaching employee on the ground of misconduct. When he/she suspends the teaching/non-teaching employee, he/she shall report it to the next meeting of the Executive Council.

(3) The Executive Council shall investigate all matters reported to it by the Vice-Chancellor about the misconduct of the teaching/non-teaching employee whether he/she has been suspended or not. The Executive Council may appoint a Committee for the purpose. The teaching/non-teaching employee shall be notified in writing of the charges against him/her and shall be given not less than two weeks time to submit his/her explanation in writing.

The Executive Council or the Committee may hear the teaching/non-teaching employee and take such evidence as it may consider necessary. The Executive Council may thereafter determine the continued engagement of the teaching/non-teaching employee where it deems that the misconduct of the teaching/non-teaching employee deserves to be dealt with in that manner, after it has considered the explanation and the evidence, if any, and/or the report of the Committee if one has been appointed.

8. The engagement under this agreement shall not be terminated, save as provided for in the appointment order for termination during the period of probation, except by a two-thirds majority of the Executive Council members present at the meeting, provided that the twothird majority is not less than half the total number of members of the Executive Council. The resolution shall state the reasons for the termination. Before a resolution under this clause is passed, the Executive Council shall give notice to the teaching/non-teaching employee of the proposal to determine the engagement and not less than two weeks' time to make such representation as the teaching/non-teaching employee may like to make. Every resolution terminating the services under this clause shall be passed only after consideration of representation, if any, of the teaching/non-teaching employee.

9. The teaching/non-teaching employee may, at anytime, terminate his/her engagement by giving the Vice-Chancellor three months' notice in writing or by payment of an amount equal to three months' salary in lieu of notice.

10. On the termination of this engagement under whatever clause, the teaching/nonteaching employee shall deliver to the University all books, equipments, records and such other articles belonging to the University as may be due from him/her.

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## REGULATIONS DEALING WITH TRAVELLING AND DAILY ALLOWANCES OF PERSONS WHO ARE NOT EMPLOYEES OF THE UNIVERSITY

#### 1. TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE:

Members of the General Council, Executive Council, Academic Council, Finance Committee, Selection Committees, External Examiners or any of their sub-committees, shall be paid travelling allowance as follows:

- i. Where the journeys are made by Air: Return Air fare by the economy class.
- ii. Travel by Train: A.C. First Class or 2nd Class A.C., 2-tier return fare or the actual fare paid, whichever is less, together with the reservation charges paid.
- iii. Journey by Taxi/Own Car: When the journey is performed by own car, the T.A. shall be payable @ Rs.10/- per k.m. (Rupees Ten Per Kilometer). In other cases, T.A. will be payable as per prevalent Government rules, amended and updated from time to time.

#### 2. DAILY ALLOWANCE:

Payment of daily allowance to members of the General Council, Executive Council, Academic Council, Finance Committee etc. shall be payable as per prevalent Government rules, amended and updated from time to time.

@ Rs.500/- per day

NOTE:

- (a) Local experts/members will be entitled to the reimbursement of actual conveyance charges in addition to the sitting fee/honorarium, when the University has not provided its conveyance.
- (b) Travel to/from airport/railway stations: Conveyance hire charges incurred by the member/expert for travel from/to residence/Head Quarters to/from the airport/railway station as the case may be and from airport/railway station to the place of meeting/stay and back at the Station of meeting will be reimbursed.
- (c) The University may provide suitable accommodation to the outstation members during their official visits.

#### 3. SITTING FEES:

Members of General Council, Executive Council and Academic Council of the University attending various meetings shall be paid sitting fee @ Rs.2500/- (Rupees Two Thousand Five Hundred) per day; Members of the Finance Committee shall be paid sitting fee @ Rs.2000/- (Rupees Two Thousand), and Experts attending Selection Committees meetings, External Examiners/Evaluators may be paid appropriate Sitting Fee decided by the Vice-Chancellor depending upon the nature and duration of work.

Manash will only be the second IDIA scholar to be studying at Hidayatullah National Law University after Sanjana Roy, who joined your university in 2012.

Manash comes from a family with very limited financial means, and grew up in adverse conditions in Assam. He lost his father at a very early age and his mother, a homemaker, struggles to make ends meet with him and his younger brother, who is in class X, with a meager income of Rs. 4000 a month. Although his parents have a

relatively humble educational background, Manash has expressed a great desire in taking up law as a career and make his mother proud. He has shown a great zeal towards cracking CLAT and pursuing law and is a hard worker.

Now that he has managed to secure entry to the university of his dreams, however, Manash is facing the stark reality of the financial crunch that his family has always faced. It is quite impossible for his family to bear the expenses of his further studies, let alone the considerably high costs of a premier national law university that comes to approximately Rs. 1,71,600 annually (for fees alone). Combined with additional living costs, stipendiary expenses, internship and travel costs and assorted expenditure for the next five years, it is well-nigh impossible for Manash and his family to manage.

Request for Fee Waiver:

The National Law University of India (NLSIU), the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences (WBNUJS) and the National Law University Delhi (NLUD) have in the past committed to granting fee waivers to all IDIA scholars who gain admission into their universities. This year, two of our scholars secured admission into NLSIU and one into WBNUJS, and all three were granted full fee waivers. Therefore, we appeal to you to extent a similar waiver to Manash at this point, failing which his dreams of studying at one of the best institutes of legal education in the country will remain unfuffilled. Additionally, we plead you to commit to grant fee waivers to our scholars who seek admission to your university in the future.

We hope this sincere request on our part will meet your approval, for which we shall be really grateful, and which would allow students from limited financial means to fulfill their dreams of a premier legal education by studying at HNLU.

# INTRODUCTION

Hidayatullah National Law University has been established by the State Government by enactment of Hidayatullah National University of Law Chhattisgarh Act, 2003 (No. 10 of 2003). It is recognized by the University Grants Commission u/s 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act of 1956 and also by the Bar Council of India u/s 7 (1) of the Advocates Act 1961. Named after one of the great legal luminaries of India Justice Mohammad Hidayatullah, HNLU was established in May 2003 by the Government of Chhattisgarh with a view to impart and advance legal education by engaging in teaching and research, and to develop among students a sense of responsibility to serve the society in the field of law by taking to advocacy and reforms in law and justice administration system. Sixth in the series of establishment of National Law Universities/Schools in India, from a modest beginning in 2003, HNLU has been making rapid strides to become a Centre of Excellence in legal education in the country and is in the process of transforming itself into a world class institution. Hon'ble Mr. Justice H. L. Dattu, Chief Justice of India, is the Visitor, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Navin Sinha, Chief Justice, High Court of Chhattisgarh, is the Chancellor and Prof. (Dr.) Sukh Pal Singh is the Vice-Chancellor of the University.

## 1. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

As per the Act, following are the authorities of the University: (i) The General Council; (ii) The Executive Council (iii) The Academic Council (iv) The Finance Committee; and (v)Such other authorities as may be prescribed by the Regulations. The General Council is the supreme body of the University. The Academic Council is the highest academic body of the University. The Executive Council is the highest executive body of the University. The administration, management and control of the University is vested in the Executive Council. As per the Act, following are the officers of the University namely: (a) The Vice Chancellor (b) The Registrar (c) The Finance Officer (d) The Controller of Examinations, and (e) Such other officers as may be prescribed by Regulations. Important decisions pertaining to administration, management and control of the University are taken by the General Council and Executive Council of the University. The decisions pertaining to academic matters are considered after the recommendations of the Academic Council meeting.

## Dr. Deepak Kumar Srivastava


## **Assistant Professor (Law)**

### 5. COMMITTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY:

### Proctorial Board:

To solve the student problems and for maintaining discipline among the students, one proctorial board is functioning in the University. The proctorial board makes recommendations to the Vice-Chancellor on various issues and after approval, the proposed action is implemented. The students are guided by the proctorial board on various issues.

### Anti Ragging Committee:

An Anti-Ragging Committee has been constituted in the University to check instances of ragging. The Anti Ragging Committee consists of female and male faculty members which takes rounds on routine basis and surprise checks. Stringent punishments are applicable as per the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, UGC Regulations and Chhattisgarh Act, to check any sort of ragging.

### **Gender Sensitization Committee:**

As per the decision passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Writ Petition No.666/1992, a gender sensitization committee has been constituted in the University for receiving complaints and proposing suitable action in case of any event of gender harassment. A Female Faculty Member has been nominated as Chairman of the Committee.

### **Right To Information Cell:**

In compliance of the Right to Information Act 2005, Hidayatullah National Law University has constituted a Right to Information Cell. Public Information Officer of HNLU and the First Appellate Authority of the University are also designated for fulfillment of the provisions of the RTI Act, 2005.

### 6. INFRASTRUCTURE:

The new campus of HNLU is the glorious result of the excellence of human effort and human spirit. His Excellency Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, the then President of India laid the Foundation Stone of the permanent building of this University on 28.01.2004, in the presence of His Excellency Lt. Gen. K.M. Seth, the then Governor of Chhattisgarh and Hon'ble Dr. Raman Singh, the Chief Minister of Chhattisgarh. The Government of Chhattisgarh has been kind enough to allot the required land and give necessary financial assistance for the construction of the new campus, additional New Boys and Girls Hostel, Auditorium and Landscaping and Beautification of the campus.

The University is located in a serene and pollution free environment spread over 65 acres of land abutting a beautiful lake on the backside. The circular academic and administrative building has been built on the design of the Parliament of India and is fully equipped with the State-of-the-art infrastructure, modern teaching aids and equipments important for academic pursuits.

The Academic and Administrative Building has a unique Amphitheatre at its centre which is similar to the Amphitheatre of Athens (Greece). The amphitheatre can accommodate more than 1000 people at a time and is tastefully used for cultural activities/common gatherings. It also has an air-conditioned Conference Hall having acoustic treatment and a seating capacity of 400 persons. The University has 21 air-conditioned class-rooms fitted with modern teaching aids and equipments which create a quality academic environment. It has a well-equipped and fully air-conditioned Computer Lab with internet facility. The Computer Lab is furnished with modern computer furniture/cubicles having around 200 computer terminals/nodes. Additionally, the University provides a fully Wi-Fi enabled campus. The language lab equipped with modern gadgets and learning tools helps in improving the writing and presentation skills of the students.

The University has a beautifully designed three-storied library with air-conditioned reading halls having a seating capacity of 650 students at a time. The structure of the University library is similar to the library of London School of Economics. The library has numerous modern stacks with varied and rich collection of text books, journals,

reference books, periodicals and a printing centre operated by the university for the benefit of the students. The library regularly subscribes to the useful legal databases such as Manupatra, Westlaw, HEIN Online, SCC Online, Lexis Nexis, JSTOR, etc. for the benefit of the students and faculty as well. It also houses environment-friendly spacious VIP lounges which are just below the open-to-sky area protected from rain and direct sunlight by transparent polymer sheets. All the day long, this area of the library is lighted by natural light. The lush green amphitheatre visible through transparent glasses from the library creates an eco-friendly and aesthetic ambience for the library users to concentrate on and enjoy their reading. The teachers are provided air-conditioned chambers and personal computers with internet facility through LAN.

HNLU has a rich culture of mooting among the students. To help prepare and train the students in their mooting exercises, the University has five State-of-the-art Moot Court Halls carefully designed to match the standards of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and the High Courts. In addition to providing a conducive and competitive environment,

the university extends all possible help and financial support to the students for mooting. With the financial assistance received from the Government of Chhattisgarh, every year, the university spends Rs. 50.00 lakh for participation of students in mooting activities. This is in addition to Rs. 20.00 lakh spent annually on the participation of students in seminars and conferences. Our students, on multiple occasions, have brought laurels to the University by showing steely talent in various prestigious moot court competitions. Further, the university has also been organizing the Justice Hidayatullah Memorial National Moot Court Competition (HNMCC) annually to promote the culture of mooting among the students. Starting in 2007, it has had seven editions of HNMCC with as many as 30 Teams participating in the last edition of HNMCC held in October, 2014.

During the last four years, HNLU has made rapid strides in infrastructural development as well as academics. Apart from construction of the boundary wall, internal roads and drains, a number of new buildings such as additional staff quarters, guest house, canteen, women's P.G. hostel, women's facilities centre, a full-fledged Bank, two ATMs, etc. have come up to meet the increasing needs and requirements of students and staff. In order to cope up with the increasing pressure of students a two-storied new academic block has been constructed. The university now has adequate sports infrastructure such as cricket ground, football ground, basket ball, volley ball and badminton courts and well-equipped plush gymnasiums for both boys as well as girls. In addition to the two old hostels having a capacity of 400 each for the boys and girls, with financial assistance from the Government of Chhattisgarh, two more large hostels having 222 double occupancy rooms each for the boys and girls are being constructed. Being at the final stages of construction, these two hostels would be ready within a few months. And to add to the existing Conference Hall having a capacity to accommodate 400 people, the university is going to have a large Auditorium of 1500 capacity constructed in the near future. The construction of Vice-Chancellor's House is in the process and is likely to be completed soon. A utility centre to cater to the daily needs of the University family such as parlour, dry cleaning, provision store, fruit & juice centre, dispensary with medical store, is under construction and likely to be completed within next few months. Besides it all, one large barrack for mess and security workers, quarters for group D employees, one store-cum-workshop are also under construction and are likely to be completed within next few months.

The provision for Sewage Treatment Plant and Solar Energy System speak of our sensitivity and commitment towards clean and pollution free environment. We are grateful to the Government of Chhattisgarh that CREDA has provided the Solar Energy facility at a highly subsidized rate of Rs. 50 lacs and it will also be providing free maintenance services for five years. Landscaping and beautification of the University campus has been taken up seriously with large scale plantation of trees for developing a clean and green campus.

In addition to these infrastructural development works, medical facilities are being provided to the students and staff through a visiting doctor and 24 hour Ambulance Services. We have two Ambulances which are used to shift the patients to the enlisted hospitals in the city in case of any kind of medical emergencies. The transport facilities have also been improved by the purchase of three new buses. The University has purchased around 150 new computers, 7 advanced photocopier machines, and adequate number of water purifiers and coolers for providing safe and cold drinking water to the students and staff. Large quantity of new furniture has also been purchased for the hostels to meet the requirements of the increasing number of students.

### 8. ANNUAL ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT:

The annual accounts are prepared in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the University and as per the General Accounting Policies and General Financial Rules. The books of accounts for the period F.Y. 2011-2012, 2012-13 and 2013-14 have been audited by the Chartered Accountant. The books of accounts for the F.Y. 2011-12 have been audited by the Local Fund Audit. Request has been made to the Chartered Accountant as well as Local Fund Audit for audit of books of accounts for the subsequent years.

### 9. MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS:

The records are maintained as per the General Financial Rules including the cash book, cash advance registers, assets registers, dead stock register, stationery stock register etc.

### 10. SCHOOLS OF THE UNIVERSITY AS CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE:

In order to create adequate opportunities for research and motivate the faculty to undertake research projects in emerging and specialized areas of law and related socioeconomic and political issues facing the society and the state, the University proposes to set up five Centres of Excellence as part of the University's effort to contribute to research and knowledge creation. They are as follows:

- A. Centre for Environmental Law and Sustainable Development (CELSD)
- B. Centre for Labour Laws and Industrial Safety Management (CLLISM)
- C. Centre for Intellectual and Industrial Property Rights (IIPR)
- D. Centre for Public Policy, Governance and Development (CPPGD)
- E. Centre for Empowerment of Weaker Sections of the Society (CEWSS)

These five Centres of Excellence will function as specialized Centres of Research and will be provided with specific research budgets for enabling the faculty members associated with these centres to undertake research in their chosen areas of specialization and according to the Centre's mandate and objectives. Each of these Centres will be headed by senior faculty members designated as Directors and they will coordinate the research activities of each of these centres. In order to help the faculty in carrying out their research, each of these centres will be provided with required infrastructural support and staff in the form of research associates who will provide research/technical assistance to the faculty in their research work.

## 11. INTRODUCTION OF PIONEERING/GROUND-BREAKING ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR:

## A. COMMON LAW ADMISSION TEST-2013

The sixth edition of the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) 2013 was organized by the Hidayatullah National Law University, Raipur. In keeping with its avowed objectives, every possible effort was made to conduct the CLAT-2013 so as to ensure the entry of the best talents to the premier National Law Universities in India. Concerted efforts were made not only to widen the reach of CLAT and to make it more inclusive, but also to raise its standard by introducing important policy measures such as lowering the percentage of marks secured in the qualifying examination, introduction of 'negative marking' and overhauling of the examination system. Total 29,548 forms were received at UG level and 1,386 forms at PG level. Keeping in view the increasing number of applicants, adequate arrangements were made for conducting CLAT-2013 in 48 Test Centres Spread over 20 cities. This CLAT 2013 has been reported by media to be one of the Best CLATs ever organized by any of the NLUs.

### B. UPCOMING NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY AWARD 2015

In the National Legal Summit and Awards 2015, out of the total nominations received, Hidayatullah National Law University, Naya Raipur has been conferred the prestigious "Upcoming National Law University" Award by the Communication Multimedia and Infrastructure Association (CMAI), New Delhi and International Conference on ICT in Law for Digital India and Make in India, on 20th May 2015. The award was given to the University by the Chief Guest of the Function Hon'ble Shri D.V. Sadanand Gowra, Minister of Law & Justice, Government of India.

### SAMANVAY:

The University has a Legal and Social Service Committee (LSSC) comprising of faculty members and students. This committee takes steps towards creating social and legal awareness among the people in the neighbourhood villages. The university has undertaken the task of creating legal awareness among the marginalized communities and villages under the initiative of 'Samanvay Programme', which is an endeavour of the students of the university as social responsible human being. Over the years, several legal awareness and blood donation camps have been organized under this programme. The university has a Free Legal Aid Cell in its campus which is registered under the District Legal Service Authority, Raipur incorporating the NALSA guidelines. This Cell is headed by a panel of lawyers; faculty members and students to provide free legal aid to people. Through LSSC, legal aid clinics are conducted in the neighbouring villages wherein the villagers express their problems and seek redressal to those problems. Under the Samanvay Programme, students are also engage in teaching the school children in the neighbourhood village of Upparwara. They also organize academic and extra-curricular activities such as speech, essay writings, paintings and sports events.

The University organized a Free Legal Aid Camp at Village Uparawara on 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2012. The camp was organized for providing legal advice on the issues of land acquisition, property matters and family disputes. The panel of experts included Civil Judge Ms. Radhika Saini, Nayab Tehsildar Mr. Narendra Sahu and Officials from New Raipur Development Authority.

The University organized Second Free Legal Aid Camp at Village Kendri, Abhanpur on 15<sup>th</sup> April 2012 to provide information about various government schemes to villagers.

## Earth Hour Celebration:

Hidayatullah National Law University celebrated Earth Hour on 28th March, 2015. It was observed from 20:30 hour to 21:30 hour. All the faculty members, non-teaching staff, and students participated in this celebration to conserve energy and draw the world's attention to the cause of environmental degradation.

### 13. ENDOWMENTS:

### THE UNIVERSITY PROPOSES THE FOLLOWING ENDOWMENTS:

### I. Endowments for Creation of Physical Facilities

- (a) Institutions and individuals may make a one time contribution for construction of Buildings or floors/wings of the Buildings like Hostels/Academic Block/Library Block/ Faculty Block.
- (b) Institutions and individuals can make a one time contribution of not less than Rupees Five Lakhs to the University for providing any or part of the following:

(i) Audio-Visual and other facilities for the Seminar Hall and the Hall could be named after the Donor or his nominee;

(ii) Facilities for the Moot Court Hall and the Hall could be named after the Donor or his nominee;

(iii) Educational equipment and teaching aids including computers;

(iv) Matador/Bus to Students for Legal Aid Work; and other clinical activities;

(v) Rooms for participation in Continuing Education programmes.

### **II.** Endowments for Institution of Chairs

- (a) An Endowment Chair can be instituted by donating a sum of not less than Rupees Thirty Lakhs or One Hundred Thousand US Dollars as corpus fund.
- (b) The Chair can be named after an institution or an individual in any specific branch of Law or a subject of inter-disciplinary area.
- (c) The Endowment amount shall be invested in bank deposits or such other safe deposits like Unit Trust of India so that the maximum possible annual interest is accrued;
- (d) The expenditure on the salary and other service and research requirements of the appointee to the Chair shall be met out of the proceeds of the endowment amount;

Provided, that if in any particular year expenditure over and above the income from the deposits is incurred the same shall be met by the University.

Provided also that the unspent balance, if any, in the interest accrued in any year shall be added to the corpus of the Endowment;

(e) The Executive Council shall invite eminent academicians or jurists to occupy the chair on the basis of the recommendations of a duly appointed Selection Committee.

### III. Endowment Lectures

The University also proposed to organize endowment lectures in honour of the person the donor would like the University to organize. For this, the donor has to make a contribution of Rs.10,00,000/-. The series of lectures delivered would be published in the form of a book for under circulation.

### IV. Endowment Lecture

The University also has a scheme to organize endowment lecture in honour of the person the donor would like the University to organize. For this, the donor has to make a contribution of Rs.5,00,000/-. The lecture delivered would be published in the form of a booklet.

### V. Endowment for institution of Scholarships

- (a) Scholarships/Fellowships/Freeships for deserving and meritorious Undergraduate and/or Post-graduate students can be instituted by Institutions or individuals on donating a sum not less than Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty Thousand:
- (b) For the accrual of maximum possible interest the endowment amount shall be invested in fixed deposits;
- (c) The University shall pool together the interest earned from the donations for Scholarships in a year and shall award such number of Scholarships/Freeships/ Fellowships to deserving students as the Faculty Committee may decide in any particular year. The main criterion for all such awards of Scholarships/Freeships/ Fellowship shall be merit coupled with means. The decision of the Selection Committee as approved by the Vice Chancellor shall be final;
- (d) (i) A donor who wishes to name the Scholarships after an institution or an individual he can do so with the approval of the University by donating a sum of not less than Rupees Five Lakhs. Ordinarily these Scholarships shall be awarded purely on consideration of academic merit and achievement. However, any specific conditions of the donor for the award of the scholarship shall be fulfilled once agreed by the University.

(ii) Once a Scholarship under this clause is awarded it will continue for the full period of the programme which the candidate is pursuing provided a report of satisfactory progress is made by the Selection Committee. In case of unsatisfactory progress, as determined by the Selection Committee, the Scholarship will be terminated on the recommendation of the Selection Committee and with the approval of the Vice Chancellor.

(iii) The donors will be informed the names of the students who are awarded the Scholarships, as soon as they are announced by the University.

## VI. Endowments for Institution of Gold Medals

(a) A Gold Medal can be instituted by Institutions or individuals upon donation of a sum of not less than Rupees Fifty Thousand;

(b)The endowment amount shall be invested in fixed deposits which earn the maximum possible interest;

(c) The interest so derived shall be utilized for the award of the Gold Medal and the unspent balance, shall be added to the corpus of the endowment;

(d) The donor can with the agreement of the University institute the gold medal in the name of an institution or individual.

(e) The Medal to be awarded shall have inscribed on it the name of the medal and the name of the recipient;

RECEITAR 62 HIDAVATULLAH NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY RAIPUR (C.G.) (f) The selection of candidates for the award of the Medals shall be done by a Selection Committee in accordance with prescribed Rules. The decision of the University shall be final and no representation shall be entertained in this regard;

(g) The donor shall be informed the name of the student selected for the award by the University.

### VII. Student Welfare Fund:

(a) Institutions and individuals can make contributions at periodical intervals of a sum of not less than Rupees Ten Thousand exclusively to the student welfare fund.

(b) The amount in the fund shall be exclusively utilized for the welfare of Students and the Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of the students (including travel expenses) in accordance with the guidelines prescribed by a Selection Committee.

(c) The administration of the money in the fund shall be based on the recommendations of the Selection Committee and with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.

(d) Matching grants, if any, received from the U.G.C. in this regard may be added to the Fund.

### VIII. Faculty Development Fund:

(a) Institutions or individuals can donate a sum of not less than Rupees Twenty Thousand towards the Faculty Development Fund.

(b) The fund amount shall be invested in fixed deposits and the interest accrued on the corpus of the Fund shall be utilized for the Faculty Development and other Schemes/Faculty Welfare measures.

(c) A Selection Committee shall formulate in due course the detailed guidelines and norms for the usage and administration of the fund which shall be implemented with the approval of the Executive Council.
