### Compendium on Right to Information Act, 2005

PUBLIC AUTHORITY: HIDAYATULLAH NATIONAL LAW UNIVERSITY, NAVA RAIPUR, ATAL NAGAR, RAIPUR.

### *Introduction:-*

This compendium seeks to highlight the function, and activities of the Hidayatullah National Law University, Nava Raipur, Atal Nagar, Raipur and to promote transparency and accountability in the working of the University. The Objective of the Compendium is also to provide easy access to the public who wish to have any information relating to the functioning of the University. The information, which may be required from the Public Authority, will be made available on application in accordance with the rules framed in this regard under the Right to Information Act 2005. The Public authority has already notified the Public Information Officer as at Section 4(1) (b) (xvi) of RTIA 2005 of this compendium.

### **Section 4(1) (b) (i) of RTIA 2005**

The particulars of its or organizations, functions and duties;

- 1. Hidayatullah National University Law (HNLU) Chhattisgarh, Act, 2003 (No. 10 of 2003):- An Act to provide for establishment and incorporation of the Hidayatullah National University of Law, Chhattisgarh for the purposes of advancement of learning, teaching, research and diffusion of knowledge in the field of law and allied sciences: as also to cater to the needs of the society by developing professional skills and to train lawyers of national and international repute, train persons intending to take up advocacy, judicial service, law officers/ managers and legislative draftsman as their profession and matters incidental thereto.
- 2. Establishment and incorporation of the National University of Law, Chhattisgarh:- (1) with effect from such date as the State Government may be notification appoint, there shall be established in the State of Chhattisgarh, a University by the name of Hidayatullah National University of Law, Chhattisgarh which shall consist of the Chancellor, Vice Chancellor, the General Council, the Executive Council, the Academic Council and the Registrar; the capital expenditure for the establishment of the University shall be borne by the State Government.
- 3. The objects of the University:- (1) The objects of the University shall be;
  - (a) To advance and disseminate learning and knowledge of law and research and to ensure its proper role in national development;
  - (b) to develop in the students and research scholars a sense of responsibility to serve society in the field of law by developing skills in regard to advocacy, judiciary & other legal services, legislation, law reforms and the like;
  - (c) to prepare and train lawyers of national and international repute and with the high moral and ethical values:
  - (d) to advance professional education and also to provide adequate orientation and training to judicial officer and others who are involved in the administration of justice;
  - (e) to impart training and conduct refresher courses of law teachers, judicial officers, advocates and other persons engaged or interested in legal field;
  - (f) to organize lectures, seminars, symposia and conferences, to promote legal, knowledge and to make law and legal processes efficient instruments of social development;
  - (g) to hold examinations and confer degree, diploma, certificate and other academic distinctions and to do all such things as are incidental, necessary or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects of the University;
  - (2) The University shall be open to all persons irrespective of race, creed caste, class or religion.
- **4. Powers and functions of the University:-** The powers and functions of the university shall be
  - i. to administer and manage the university and such centers for research education and instruction as are necessary for the furtherance of the objects of the University;
  - ii. to provide for instruction in such branches of knowledge or learning pertaining to law, as the University may think fit and to make provision for research and for the advancement and dissemination of knowledge of law;
- iii. to organize and undertake extramural teaching and extension service;
- iv. to hold examinations and to grant diplomas or certificates, and to confer degrees and other academic distinctions on persons subject to such condition as the University may determine and to withdraw any such diplomas; certificates degrees or other academic distinctions for good and sufficient cause;
- v. to confer honorary degrees or other distinction in the manner laid down in the Regulations;
- vi. to fix, demand and receive fees and other charges;
- vii. to institute and maintain halls and hostels and to recognize places of residence for the students of the University and to withdraw such recognition accorded to any such place of residence;
- viii. to establish such special centers, specialized study centers or ether units for research and instruction as are, in the opinion of the University necessary for the furtherance of its objects;
- ix. to supervise and control the residence and to regulate the discipline of the students of the University and to make arrangements for promoting their health;
- **x.** to make special arrangements in respect of the residence, discipline and teaching of women students;

- **xi.** to create academic, technical, administrative, ministerial and other posts in the university and to make appointments thereto;
- **xii.** to regulate and enforce discipline among the employees of the University and to take such disciplinary measures as may be deemed necessary;
- **xiii.** to institute professorships, associate professorships, assistant professorships, adjunct professorships, part-time lectureships, and any other teaching, academic or research posts required by the University;
- **xiv.** to appoint persons as professors, assistant professors, associate professors, assistant professors visiting professors, pat-time lectures or otherwise as teachers and researcher of the university;
- **xv.** to institute and award fellowships, scholarships, prizes and medals;
- **xvi.** to provide for printing, reproduction and publication of research and other works and to organize exhibitions;
- **xvii.** to sponsor and undertake research in all aspects of law, justice and social development;
- **xviii.** to collaborate with any other organization n the matter of education, training and research in law, justice, social development and allied subjects for such purposes as may be agreed upon on such terms and conditions as the University may from time to time determine;
  - **xix.** to collaborate with nationally and internationally reputed institutions of higher learning having objects wholly or partially similar to those of the University by exchange of teachers and generally in such manner as may be conducive to the common objects;
  - **xx.** to regulate the expenditure and to manage the accounts of the University;
- **xxi.** to advance professional education and also to provide adequate orientation and training to judicial officers and others who are involved in the administration of Justice;
- **xxii.** to impart training and conduct refresher courses for law teachers, judicial officers, advocates and other persons in legal field;
- **xxiii.** to spread and promote legal literacy and legal awareness among citizens at urban and rural level:
- **xxiv.** to provide legal aid to needy persons at pre-litigation and litigation stage;
- **xxv.** to undertake research on traditional legal systems especially those among tribal communities and explore their usefulness in administration of justice in the present.
- **xxvi.** to develop teaching and research of such original sources of literature on which the modern law and the concept of non-violence and peace is based and to explore their usefulness in the administration of justice in modern India;
- **xxvii.** to publish research studies, treatises, books, periodicals, reports and other literature relating to law and other related fields;
- **xxviii.** to establish and maintain within the University premises or elsewhere, such class rooms and study halls as the University may consider necessary and adequately furnish the same and to establish and maintain such libraries and reading rooms as may appear convenient necessary for the University.
  - **xxix.** To receive grants, subventions, subscriptions, donations and gifts for the purpose of University consistent with the objects for which the University is established;
  - **xxx.** To purchase, take on lease or accept as gifts or otherwise, any land or building or works which may be necessary or convenient for the purpose of the University and on such terms and conditions as it may think fit and proper and to construct or alter and maintain any such building or works;
  - **xxxi.** To sell, exchange, lease or otherwise dispose of all or any portion of the properties of the University movable or immovable, on such terms as it may think fit and proper without prejudice to the interest and activates of the University;
- **xxxii.** To draw and accept, to make and endorse, to discount and negotiate, promissory notes bills of Exchange cheques or either negotiable instruments pertaining to its affairs and activates;
- **xxxiii.** To execute conveyances, transfers, reconveyances mortgages, leases, licenses and agreements in respect property movable or immovable including Government acuities belonging to the University or to be acquired for the purpose of the University,
- **xxxiv.** To appoint in order to execute an instrument or transact any business of the University, any person as it may deem fit;
- **xxxv.** To enter into any agreement with the Central Government, State Governments, the University Grants Commission or other persons and Societies for receiving grants;
- **xxxvi.** To accept for furthering the objects of the University; grants of money, securities or property of any kind on such terms as it may deem expedient;

- **xxxvii.** To raise and borrow money on bonds, mortgages, promissory notes or other obligations or securities founded or based upon all or any of the properties and assets of the University or without any securities and upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and to pay out of the funds of the University, all expenses incidental to the raising of money and to repay and redeem any money borrowed;
- **xxxviii.** To invest the funds of the University or money entrusted to University in or upon such securities, and is such manner as it may deem fit, and from time to time transpose any investment;
  - **xxxix.** To make such Regulations as may, from time to time, be considered necessary for regulating the affairs and the management of the University and to alter, modify and to rescind them;
    - **xl.** To make provisions for pension, insurance, provident fund and gratuity for the benefit of the academic, technical, administrative, ministerial and other staff, in such manner and subject to the relevant laws in force and to such conditions as may be prescribed by the Regulations, as tit may deem fit and to make such grants as it may think fit for the benefit of any employees of the University and to aid in establishment and support of the association, institutions, funds, trusts and conveyance calculated to benefit the staff and the students of the University;
    - **xli.** To delegate all any of its powers to the Vice Chancellor of the university or any committee or to any one or more members of its body or its officers; and
    - **xli.** To do all such other acts and thinks as the University may consider necessary, conducive or incidental to the attainment or enlargement of the aforesaid objects or any one of them.
    - 5. Teaching of the University (1) All recognized teaching in connection with the degree, diploma and certificate and any other academic distinction of the University shall be conducted, under the administrative control of the Executive Council, by the teachers of the University in accordance with the syllabus presided by the Regulations.
      - (2) the courses and curricula and the authorities responsible for organizing such teaching shall be such as may be prescribed by the Regulations.

### **Section 4(1) (b) (ii) of RTIA 2005**

The powers and duties of its officers and employees;

### Powers and Functions of the Visitor and Chancellor

- **1. Visitor of the University:-** (1) The Chief justice of the Supreme Court of India shall be the Visitor of the University.
  - (2) The Visitor shall preside over the convocation of the University.
  - (3) The Visitor shall have the right to call for the report on any matter pertaining to the affairs of the University.
- **2. Chancellor of the University: -** (1) the Chief Justice of the High Court of Judicature of Chhattisgarh shall be chancellor of the University.
  - (2) The chancellor shall appoint the Vice Chancellor of the university in accordance with the procedure and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Statutes.
- **3.** The Powers of the Visitor and the Chancellor:- (1) the Visitor and the Chancellor shall have the following powers, namely:-
  - (a) To give direction, take action, or do anything as required under the provisions of this Act and the Statutes:
  - (b) To case an inspection by such person, as he may direct, of any work, activity or examination of the University, college, or regional centers;
  - (c) To give his views or advice to the Vice Chancellor in the matters wherein and inspection or inquiry has been made under clause (b).
  - (2) Where either the Visitor or the Chancellor of the University under clause (b) of sub-section
  - (1) has ordered an inspection or inquiry, the University may depute one of its officers to represent it in such inspection or inquiry.
  - (3) The Visitor or the Chancellor shall communicate the result of the inspection or inquiry and his advice to the Vice Chancellor.
  - (4) The result and the advice referred to in sub-section (3) shall be communicated by the Vice Chancellor to the Executive Council with his comments for such action it may propose to take,

and the action so taken shall be communicated by the Executive Council to the Visitor or the Chancellor, as the case may be through the Vice Chancellor.

- (5) Where the Executive Council does not, within reasonable time, take action to the satisfaction of the Visitor or the Council does not, within reasonable time, take action to the satisfaction of the Visitor or the Chancellor may, after considering explanation, if any, furnished or representation made by the Executive Council, issue such directions as he may think fit and the Executive Council shall comply with such directions.
- **4. Authorities of the University :-** The following shall be the authorities of the University, namely:-
  - 1. The General Council;
  - 2. The Executive Council;
  - 3. The Academic Council:
  - 4. The Finance Committee; and
  - 5. Such other authorities as may be prescribed by the Regulations;
  - The General Council:- (1) the General Council shall be supreme body of the University.
     (2) The powers and the functions of the General Council shall be such as are given under the Statutes.
  - 2. The Executive Council: (1) The Executive Council shall be the highest executive body of the University. (2) The administration, management and control of the University shall vest in the Executive Council, which shall control and administer the property and funds of the University. (3) The composition of the Executive Council shall be such as is specified in the Schedule.
  - 3. The Academic Council: (1) The Academic Council shall be the highest academic body of the University and shall, subject to the provisions of the Act and the Regulations have power of control and general regulation of and be responsible for the maintenance of standards of instruction, education and examination of the University. (2) The Academic Council shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be conferred or imposed upon it by this Act or the Regulations; and shall have the right to advise the Executive Council on all academic matters. (3) The Academic Council shall have the power to propose Regulations on all the matters specified in clause 15 of the Schedule and matter incidental and related thereto.
- 5. Officers of the University: The following shall be the officers of the University; namely:-
  - (a) The Vice Chancellor,
  - (b) The Registrar
  - (c) The Finance Officer
  - (d) The Controller of Examinations, and
  - (e) Such other officers as may be prescribed by Regulations.

### **Section 4(1) (b) (iii) of RTIA 2005**

The procedure followed in the decision-making process, including channels of supervision and accountability;

The files are put up and routed through the Section Head/ Finance Officer /Registrar to Vice-Chancellor for approval and orders, thereafter if necessary for a final approval of the Executive Council.

### **Section 4(1) (b) (iv) of RTIA 2005**

*The norms set by it for the discharge of its functions;* 

The Hidayatullah National Law University, Nava Raipur, Atal Nagar, Raipur is governed by the procedure as indicated in the Chhattisgarh Act No.10 of 2003 which is known as Hidayatullah National University of Law Act 2003 and in accordance with the resolutions passed by the General Council, Executive Council, Academic Council, Finance Committee and various committees from time to time.

The University follows the directives of the Ministry of Law and Justice, Government of Chhattisgarh, the Bar Council of India and University Grants Commission and its own regulations for administrative and academic matters.

### **Section 4(1) (b) (v) of RTIA 2005**

The rules, regulations, instructions, manuals and records, held by it or under its control or used by its employees for discharging its functions;

List of rules, regulations, instructions, manual and records held by public authority or under its control or used by its employees for discharging functions are:

- 1. Chhattisgarh Act No.10 of 2003/ Hidayatullah National University of Law Act 2003.
- 2. Rules & Regulations as approved by the Executive Council and the General Council.
- 3. Regulations of the University Grants Commission and Bar Council of India.
- 4. Any other orders and rules prescribed by Government of Chhattisgarh as applicable.

### **Section 4(1) (b) (vi) of RTIA 2005**

A statement of the categories of documents that are held by it or under its control;

The University has files related to administrative, accounts and academic matters along with the University. The University also has the following reports or documents under its control:-

- 1. Dossiers of Faculty and Staff of the University
- 2. Files relating to the functioning of the University.
- 3. Books of Accounts/ Cash Book.
- 4. Registers of stock etc.
- 5. Examination Scripts.
- 6. Agenda papers and resolutions of the meetings of the University statutory bodies.

### **Section 4(1) (b) (vii) of RTIA 2005**

The particulars of any arrangement that exists for consultation with or representation by, the members of the public in relation to the formulation of its policy or implementation thereof;

Capacity/Career Building Scheme for the students/legal practitioners are conceptualized by the University and the implementation of this scheme is executed with the support of the Government of Chhattisgarh and University Grants Commission. The University has been conducting regular placement programme, moot courts, legal Aid services, other cultural activities, research projects, training programmes etc. during the academic sessions. Eminent Scholars, Judges, Lawyers, Government Officers, Political Leader s, international personalities and visionaries are consulted and invited for special lectures for the benefit of the students. The University offers consultancy services in the field of legal profession including training of their human resources. It also extends Resource Person supports to different Governments & Private sector enterprises as and when required. National and State Level workshops on legal awareness are conducted by the University from time to time.

### ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY:

Hidayatullah National Law University (HNLU) was established under the Hidayatullah National University of Law, Chhattisgarh, Act, (No. 10 of 2003) 2003. It is recognized by the University Grants Commission u/s 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956 and also by the Bar Council of India u/s 7 (1) of the Advocates Act, 1961. Named after one of the great legal luminaries of India Justice Mohammad Hidayatullah, HNLU was established in May 2003 by the Government of Chhattisgarh with a view to impart and advance legal education by engaging in teaching and research, and to develop among students a sense of responsibility to serve the society in the field of law by taking to advocacy and reforms in law and justice administration system.

HNLU is the first National Level Institute established in the new State of Chhattisgarh in the year 2003 and was the sixth among the current law universities established in the country. With a vibrant student community of 950 under graduate, post graduate and research scholars, HNLU is a front line law school in the country. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Arun Mishra, Judge, Supreme Court of India is the Visitor and Hon'ble Mr. Justice P.R. Ramachandra Menon, Chief Justice of the High Court of Chhattisgarh is the Chancellor. Prof. (Dr.) V.C. Vivekanandan is the Vice- Chancellor of the University and Dr.Ayan Hazra is the Registrar in charge of the University.

### **INFRASTRUCTURE:**

The circular academic and administrative block has been built on the design of the Parliament of India and is fully equipped with the State-of-the-art infrastructure, modern teaching aids and equipments important for academic pursuits.

It has a unique Amphitheatre at its center which is like the Amphitheatre of Athens (Greece). The Amphitheatre can accommodate more than 1000 people at a time and is tastefully used for cultural activities/common gatherings.

It also has an air-conditioned Conference Hall having acoustic treatment and a seating capacity of 400 persons. The University has 21 air-conditioned classrooms fitted with modern teaching aids and equipments which create a quality academic environment. It has a well-equipped and fully air-conditioned Computer Lab with internet facility. The Computer Lab is furnished with computer, modern furniture / cubicles. The Law Studio is under commission and will be operational from July 2020.

The University provides a fully Wi-Fi enabled campus with a dedicated team of IT professionals working round the clock. The language lab equipped with modern gadgets and learning tools helps in improving the writing and presentation skills of the students. The university has newly constructed Women Facility Centre, Hostel for Female Research Scholars, Guest House, Canteen, Full-fledged Bank, two ATMs and Utility Centre.

### HALLS OF RESIDENCE:

As a fully residential university, HNLU has separate Halls of Residence for boys and girls. The first year students are given an accommodation of two in one room for both boys and girls in the hostels. From second year to fifth year students are given accommodation of single rooms in the hostels having a capacity of 800 rooms furnished with cots, tables and storage space. The University has a separate PG Hostel for Girls having a capacity to accommodate 30 students. Further, there are two more hostels constructed for both boys and girls.

The hostels on campus have a boys and girls dining halls with a seating capacity of 150 each. The single room hostels have a balcony to individual room and a courtyard. All the floors have water coolers and a centralized RO plant is under commission. The solar heater equipped with alternate electrical heater supplies water to the shower rooms. Both Boys and Gils have a state of the art Gymnasium in the central hostels with indoor badminton courts. There is also a recreational TV room and table tennis facility. Outdoor badminton courts and basket ball net practice is under construction.



### **SPORTS**

The University has a full-fledged football ground, Cricket field, law tennis, two basketball courts and one volley ball court. The Colossus sports festival attract participation across the country. The University is commissioning outdoor basketball net practice in the hostel complex and yoga center in the coming academic year.

### MEDICAL FACILITIES

The University has a visiting doctor every day in the evening with a functional dispensary and emergency medicine available with the wardens. The University has two separate ambulances parked one each at the boys and the girls hostel. The Ramakrishna hospital which is around 15 minutes from the University is a multi-specialty hospital catering to the needs of the HNLU fraternity. The city of Raipur has AIIMS which is a high-specialty medical complex.

### **TRANSPORT**

The University has three buses of 50 seater capacity which shuttles in the evening from campus to city centre at periodic intervals. The transport fees of the university entitles the students for a ride to shop and meet their food and entertainment needs in the city. Apart from the University transport the city transport corporation runs buses every 20 minutes from the main road in front of the campus gate to the city centre.

The Modern airport of Raipur- Swami Vivekananda airport is 15 mintues drive from the campus and the Raipur railway station is 35 km. from the campus.



### FOOD COURT

Apart from the dining hall, the University has multineed complex where eight shops are operated on contract basis selling snacks, ice creams, beverages and minor needs. The campus has also a coffee day outlet in the shopping complex. The hostels do have a small canteen outlet catering till 2 a.m.

### CULTURAL SPACE

The University is a diverse space for students across the country living, studying and learning. There are students from every state and union territory imparting the unity in diversity spirit. The student imitative of Colossus is a three day festival of culture and sports, /The festival attracts students across the country. The festival has exposition of students creative talents of western, classical and folk genre in music and dance.



LEGAL AID

The student and faculty initiative of legal aid clinic has a long tradition at HNLU where the students actively involved in visiting prisons, courts and related places for hands on training and learning. There is a faculty coordinator involved in planning and hand holding such exercises. The committee also involves in periodic blood donation activities at campus.



### RESEARCH CENTRES

The University is revamping the research centres headed by faculty and involving young student scholars to participate in contemporary advocacy. The research policy is undergoing a major direction revamp and the focus areas identified are A. IPR B. Cyber laws C. Constitutional issues D. Corporate laws E. International Law F. Environmental law G. Gender Studies H. Indigenous people rights

LIBRARY: The University has a beautifully designed three-storied library with air-conditioned reading halls having a seating capacity of 600 students at a time. The structure of the University library is similar to the library of London School of Economics. The library has numerous modern stacks with varied and rich collection of text books, journals, reference books and periodicals. The library regularly subscribes to the useful legal databases such as Manupatra, Westlaw, HEIN Online, SCC Online, AIR Webworld, LexisNexis, JSTOR, etc. for the benefit of the students, research scholars and faculty members as well. It also houses environment-friendly spacious lounges which are just below the open-to-sky area protected from rain and direct sunlight by transparent polymer sheets. All day long, this area of the library is lighted by natural light. The lush green Amphitheatre visible through transparent glasses from the library creates an ecofriendly and aesthetic ambience for the library users to concentrate on and enjoy their reading.

### **MOOTING:**

HNLU has a rich culture of mooting among the students. To help, prepare and train the students in their mooting exercises, the University has five State-of-theart Moot Court Halls carefully designed to match the standards of the Supreme Court of India and the High Courts. In addition to providing a conducive and competitive environment, the university extends all possible help and financial support to the students for mooting. With the financial assistance received from the Government of Chhattisgarh, the university spends Rs. 1 crore every year for participation of students in moot court competitions, seminars, conferences and workshops at the national and international level. Our students, on multiple occasions, have brought laurels to the University by showing steely talent in various prestigious moot court competitions. Further, the university has also been regularly organizing since 2007 the Justice Hidayatullah Memorial National Moot Court Competition (HNMCC) on annual basis to promote the culture of mooting among the students.



### **FACULTY MEMBERS:**

HNLU has a team of highly qualified, competent and dedicated faculty members with diverse backgrounds and areas of specialization. In addition to the classroom teaching, the faculty members also attend to the individual needs of students through mentoring and consultation. For creating high quality academic ambience so as to enable the students to strive for perfection in their academic endeavours, the university offers exhaustive, diverse and cross functional curriculum to its students both at graduate and postgraduate levels. To achieve the multifarious objectives, the University regularly organizes national and international seminars, conferences, moot court competition and special guest lectures by eminent academicians and professionals from within India and abroad. The continuous assessment of students helps in an honest evaluation of the true potential of students.

### **PLACEMENT:**

Trained in various specialized areas of law, the young law graduates from HNLU have represented themselves in every sphere and spectrum of legal profession.
