In an age characterized by digital transformation and the pervasive presence of individual data, the importance of addressing privacy challenges and implications has never been more relevant.

While the concepts of privacy and data protection are closely intertwined and sometimes overlap, they are not entirely synonymous. Privacy, defined as non-interference, limited accessibility, or control over information, and data protection are interconnected but distinct. These rights are fundamental prerequisites for exercising other essential freedoms like freedom of expression, peaceful assembly, association, and religion.

The expanding market now trades personal data and utilizes it as a foundation for marketing and control strategies to enhance organizational efficiency, profitability, reputation, and services. However, this cross-organizational utilization of personal data often diverts it from its original purpose, leading to potential misuse, misrepresentation, and dissemination of inaccurate information. Consequently, the information landscape becomes more complex and less transparent. These developments underscore the need for clearer data privacy regulations.

The purpose of this round table is to foster a deeper comprehension of privacy and data protection concepts among participants, regardless of their backgrounds or expertise. Through these discussions, participants will gain practical insights and strategies to navigate the digital realm while effectively safeguarding their personal data.

The objective of this panel conversation is to explore the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, assembling a diverse group of experts to share their perspectives, propose solutions, and increase awareness about the significance of upholding personal privacy rights in the modern digital environment.
